

Legislative Update

This week was one of the busier weeks at the General Assembly this session, particularly in the Senate where the bill filing deadline was Tuesday, April 2. Activity in the House is also expected to intensify in the coming days, as House members and staff work to meet the April 16 bill filing deadline and to craft a state budget.

Meetings of significance to the Department of Public Safety continue as well. The Senate Select Committee on Prison Safety met Monday to discuss issues surrounding the recruitment and retention of prison employees. The committee is scheduled to meet again this coming Monday, April 8, and will hear from Gary Mohr, Senior Executive Advisor to Adult Correction and Juvenile Justice and a nationally recognized expert in the corrections field.

On Wednesday, budget writers for the House Appropriations Committee on Justice and Public Safety (JPS) revealed that they will have roughly \$4 million to spend this fiscal year to address the needs of all JPS agencies--DPS, the Administrative Office of the Courts, Indigent Defense Services, and the Department of Justice. Beginning next week, preliminary reports from the JPS committee will be presented to the Full Appropriations Chairs; however, the committee will not finalize its recommendations until April 25th. Raise the Age is regarded as a major initiative and, thus, will fall under the purview of the Full Appropriations committee and will not be appropriated out of available JPS resources.

Legislation was introduced on Wednesday that would fundamentally alter the structure of the department. Senate Bill 579, *Prison Reform Act of 2019*, is sponsored by Senators Bob Steinburg (R-Chowan), Floyd McKissick (D-Durham), and Norman Sanderson (R-Pamlico). Notwithstanding the bill title, SB 579 reaches far beyond prisons. The proposed legislation would remove the Division of Adult Corrections and Juvenile Justice from DPS and create the Department of Correction and the Department of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention. The bill would also direct \$1.6 million to both the Department of Correction and Department of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention. The Office of Legislative Affairs will continue to closely monitor this bill as well as the others listed below.

Bills eligible to file in 2019 with no deadlines:

- (1) Redistricting bills for House, Senate, Congress, or local entities.
- (2) Ratification of amendments to the Constitution of the United States.
- (3) Adjournment resolutions.
- (4) Bills introduced on the report of the House Committees on Appropriations, Finance, or Rules.
