Bill Booth Denise Martin Clyde Cook Eric Weaver Sr. Bob Graham Chairman Richard Allen called the February 7, 2013 conference call to order at 10:17 a.m. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the funding for the upgrade of the PPS computer database. Specifically, The Private Protective Services Board will be discussing the Management & Tracking Portal System Status & Recommended Contract award.

Attorney Jeff Gray explained the State Ethics Act, which addresses the ethics of public officials. This Act states specifically that if any Board Member has any conflict of interest, potential conflict of interest, or the appearance of a conflict, he or she should remove themselves from deliberation and vote on that matter and so state on the record.

George Fenton, Department of Justice, Training & Standards, Information Technology (IT) Division, gave opening remarks regarding the project then guided the participants through a slideshow presentation. The presentation covered the following:

During the presentation Mr. Fenton explained the following cost distribution to fund the computer upgrade:

PPS and ASL Cost Distribution

Mr. MacRae asked what DOJ ITs participation would be after five (5) years in regards to maintaining the system. Mr. Fenton explained that a portion of the funding will pay for IT Staff specialist training. This training will be conducted by the vendor and will enable DOJ IT to maintain the system (perform maintenance) independently after five (5) years have passed.

Mr. Fenton then explained the benefits of moving forward with the proposed vendor (GL Solutions). Mr. MacRae asked that he explain the benefits of the new system as it relates to both enhancing revenues and improving PPS operations. Mr. Fenton directed the Board to slide 8 of his presentation which estimated the benefits for the Private Protective Services Board, Alarm Systems Licensing Board and Department of Justice after 5-Years at \$9,265,359. He then directed the Board to a spreadsheet which provided a detailed breakdown of how the 5-year benefit computations were achieved.

Mr. Jim Stevens asked what the offset would be for the bank credit card fee. Mr. Wright explained that DOJ Financial Services has committed to absorbing the cost for the credit card fee.

Mr. MacRae asked whether or not the project would allow the use of a different badge printer if a cheaper model could be found. Mr. Fenton answered yes, as long as the vendor had the software to support the printer. Mr. Fenton stated that the vendor has a list of printers that the company currently supports.

Gary Pastor asked how long it will take to recoup the full cost of implementation. Per the benefit calculation, the cost should be regained in two (2) years. Jim Stevens stated, although cost is important, the Board must act to improve the Board's operations, which will equate to better customer service for the industry.

Mr. Bonapart pointed out that after the system has been implemented the Board will be able to measure the full benefits. Once the system has been implemented staff will eventually be spending more time approving applications instead of processing correctable denials.

Mr. MacRae asked if GL Solutions had an issue with turnover in management once implementation began. Mr. Fenton stated that he didn't see any cause for concern from that standpoint. Mr. Bonapart stated that the clients of the vendor that were interviewed did not express any change-over in personnel while implementing their system.

Mr. MacRae also wanted to know how long it would take to convert existing files to the GL Solutions database. Director Wright stated that staff has already been discussing the project. Because of the volume of paper records maintained by the Board; the conversion of paper documents to electronic files will be time consuming and we will continue to discuss the matter and determine an appropriate action plan. Our goal is to convert the documents into easily retrievable and searchable electronic files.

Mr. Fenton reminded the Board that scanners will have to be purchased to support the project. He also advised that the data that is currently in the current Power Builder database (PPS2000) will have to be converted to the new system; data clean up for those files is also part of the project.

MOTION BY MR. STEVENS TO FUND THE UPGRADE OF THE PPS COMPUTER DATABASE BY AWARDING THE CONTRACT TO GL SOLUTIONS BASED ON THE PRESENTATION AND COST BREAKDOWN PRESENTED BY GEORGE FENTON OF THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY SECTION. SECONDED BY MR. BENSON; MOTION CARRIED.

MOTION BY MR. STEVENS TO ADJOURN; SECONDED BY MR. COBBLER; MOTION CARRIED.

CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Richard Allen called the February 21, 2013 Private Protective Services Board meeting to order at 9:04 a.m. Chairman Allen welcomed all guests.

GOOD OF THE ORDER:

Attorney Jeff Gray explained the State Ethics Act, which addresses the ethics of public officials. This Act states specifically that if any Board Member has any conflict of interest, potential conflict of interest, or the appearance of a conflict, he or she should remove themselves from deliberation and vote on that matter and so state on the record.

Mr. Gregory Hatten, president of the NCAPI greeted the Board and all of the guests. Mr. Hatten stated that the association held their annual election of officers and then introduced the current board. Mr. Hatten announced that the annual NCAPI conference will be held March 24th through March 26th in Pinehurst, North Carolina. Information can be obtained from the NCAPI webpage.

MINUTES:

APPROVAL OF THE DECEMBER 13, 2012 MEETING MINUTES AND THE MINUTES FROM THE FEBRUARY 7, 2013 SPECIAL MEETING FOR FUNDING OF THE UPGRADE OF COMPUTER DATABASE.

MOTION BY MR. STEVENS TO ACCEPT THE MINUTES; SECONDED BY MR. GRAHAM; MOTION CARRIED.

SCREENING COMMITTEE REPORT:

Mr. Clark reported that the Screening Committee met on Wednesday, February 20, 2013 to review a total of 32 applications. (See report). The committee members were Mr. Clark, Mr. Benson, Mr. Cobbler, Mr. MacRae, and Ms. Martin. Mr. Clark read the report for the record.

Mr. Clark presented the following registration report for the period of December 10, 2012 through February 18, 2013. Total registrations 3,969; armed totals were 688 of which 222 were new and 324 were renewals, 2 duplicates, and 140 reissue/dual. There were a total of 8 armed Private Investigators, 1 new Private Investigator and 7 renewals, and 1 new armed Private Investigator Associate, 1 Renewal, and 1 reissue/dual. Unarmed totals were 3,270 which included 1,081 new, 1,946 renewals, 189 transfers, 23 duplicates and 31 reissue/dual. Total denials were 747 of which 242 were for cause and 515 for correctable reasons. There were 710 applications approved which were previously denied for a total of 1,467 denials reviewed.

Mr. Stevens recused himself from numbers 28, 9, 10 and 24.

MOTION BY JUDGE BURRIS TO ACCEPT THE SCREENING COMMITTEE REPORT AND THE REGISTRATION REPORT; SECONDED BY MR. MACRAE; MOTION CARRIED.

GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE REPORT:

Judge Burris reported the Grievance Committee met on Tuesday, February 19, 2013 from 8:04 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. and heard a total of 11 cases. The committee members were Judge Burris, Mr. Booth, Mr. Cook, Mr. Epley, Mr. Graham and Mr. Stevens. Judge Burris presented the attached report. (See attachment). Mr. Benson recused himself from numbers 29 and 46.

MOTION BY MR. BOOTH TO ACCEPT THE GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE REPORT; SECONDED BY MR. CLARK; MOTION CARRIED.

TRAINING & EDUCATION COMMITTEE:

Mr. Stevens advised that the Training & Education Committee met on Wednesday, February 20, 2013 from 3:00 p.m. until 4:00 p.m. The committee members were Mr. Stevens, Mr. Allen, Mr. Booth, Mr. Clark, Mr. Epley and Mr. MacRae.

Mr. Epley stated that the following eight (8) continuing education training courses have been submitted for approval: Digital Forensics (2 hours); Interview Techniques (1 hour); Criminal Defense Investigation, Effective Strategies (2 hours); Crisis Management for School Based Incident, Partnering Rural Law Enforcement and the Local School Systems (On-Line) (6 hours); Financial Security Officer Training (12 hours); Death Investigation (8 hours); Domestic Violence Investigation (8 hours) and Work Place Violence Investigation (8 hours).

MOTION BY MR. BOOTH TO ACCEPT CEU COURSE APPROVALS; SECONDED BY MR. MACRAE; MOTION CARRIED.

Mr. Booth reviewed recommendations made to the Training and Education Committee to implement the new unarmed and armed armored car service guard registration category. Mrs. Judy Pittman will be scheduling "Train the Trainer" courses to prepare trainers to teach the new unarmed and armed armored car service guard course. The dates for the "Train the Trainer" courses will be posted on the PPSB website. The committee is recommending to the full Board an implementation date of September 1, 2013. (See attached recommendations)

MOTION BY MR. BOOTH TO ACCEPT RECOMMENDATIONS TO INCLUDE AN IMPLEMENTATION DATE OF SEPTEMBER 1, 2013; SECONDED BY MR. MACRAE; MOTION CARRIED.

Mr. Bonapart announced the new PPSB education grant cycle PPSB2013-1. All applications must be received by May 31, 2013. The grant recipients will be announced at the June 20, 2013 Board meeting. The project end date is June 30, 2014.

MOTION BY MR. MACRAE TO ACCEPT THE GRANT PROCESS; SECONDED BY MRS. MARTIN; MOTION CARRIED.

SCREENING COMMITTEE:

Mr. Clark introduced Lt. Cory Kramer, President of the North Carolina Polygraph Association; to discuss possible changes to the section .0500 of the administrative rules regarding polygraph examiners. Lt. Kramer discussed each recommendation with the Board and explained why the change was necessary. Mr. Allen recommended that the Board review Lt. Kramer's changes and report back at the April Board meeting and the Board will vote at that time.

74C REWRITE COMMITTEE REPORT:

Judge Burris advised that the 74C Rewrite Committee met on February 20, 2013 from 3:00 p.m. until 4:00 p.m. The committee members were Judge Burris, Mr. Allen, Mr. Benson, Mr. Booth, Mr. Clark, Mr. Cobbler, Mr. Cook, Mr. Epley, Mr. Graham, Mr. MacRae, Mrs. Martin and Mr. Stevens.

Judge Burris gave an overview to the Board on recommended changes to North Carolina General Statute 74C. After opening remarks the Board discussed and voted on the following 74C Rewrite Committee recommendations:

- 1. 74C-3(b)(13) Require Proprietary Employer to renew every two years
- 2. 74C-8(c)(3) Extend Time to Find Substitute Qualifying Agent
- 3. 74C-8(f) Extend Time for personnel to complete the licensing process (Current Policy is 90 days)
- 4. 74C-9 Technical amendments to the Term and Renewal Section to allow the Board to consider disability or medical conditions
- 5. 74C-12(a) & (a)(1) Include Provisions that Allow for the Denial or Revocation of a certification

MOTION BY MR. BENSON TO ACCEPT ALL FIVE PROPOSED 74C CHANGES; SECONDED BY MR. CLARK; MOTION CARRIED.

FINANCE COMMITTEE:

Mr. Clark gave an overview of the February 7, 2013 Special Meeting held to discuss funding of the upgrade of the computer database. Mr. Clark asked Mr. Wright to address the Board and the audience on funding the computer database project.

Mr. Wright gave an overview of the new database and the funding streams. The new database will be funded by the Department of Justice, Alarm Systems Licensing Board and the Private Protective Services Board. Mr. Booth asked what the expected completion date would be. Mr. Wright advised that the project was scheduled to be awarded in March and completion would be a year from that date. The vendor will schedule training for the industry via webinars and other means. The industry will be notified.

MOTION BY MR. STEVENS TO ACCEPT THE REPORT AND MOVE FORWARD WITH RECOMMENDATION; SECONDED BY MR. BOOTH; MOTION CARRIED.

GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE:

Judge Burris stated that the February 19, 2013 Grievance Committee meeting extended well into the evening. The meeting was long and justified the need to periodically have a three day meeting.

Judge Burris also advised that a legal issue related to pending disciplinary matters has come to the attention of the Board and recommended that the committee go into executive session to discuss a potential legal matter with the Board's attorney.

JUDGE BURRIS MADE A MOTION THAT THE BOARD GO INTO EXECUTIVE SESSION; SECONDED BY MR. STEVENS; MOTION CARRIED.

Chairman Allen called the Board back into session.

JUDGE BURRIS MADE A MOTION THAT THE BOARD DIRECT THE ATTORNEY TO PROCEED WITH THE APPEAL IN 2008-PPS-026 AND 2008-PPS-047 REQUESTED BY THE RESPONDENT IN THOSE TWO CASES; SECONDED BY MR. STEVENS; MOTION CARRIED. MR. BENSON RECUSED HIMSELF FROM VOTE AND CONSIDERATION IN THIS MATTER.

Attorney Jeff Gray removed himself as counsel to the Board to present the following cases.

The Board received the official record for the following cases:

Jonathan Barham 12-DOJ-09141(attachment 12). Mr. Barham was present. This case was heard by Administrative Law Judge Donald W. Overby on November 27, 2012. This case involved the denial of the Petitioner's application for a private investigator associate license under 74C-8 on the grounds of Petitioner's failure to complete the application process.

Administrative Law Judge Donald W. Overby proposed that the Board rescind the denial of the application and that Petitioner be interviewed within thirty (30) days of the entry of the Final Agency Decision.

MOTION BY JUDGE BURRIS TO REVERSE THE BOARD'S INITIAL DECISION AND GRANT THE APPLICANT'S PRIVATE INVESTIGATOR'S ASSOCIATES LICENSE; SECONDED BY MR. BOOTH; MOTION CARRIED.

Richard L. Simmons 12-DOJ-07591(attachment 11). Mr. Simmons was present. This case was heard by Administrative Law Judge Donald W. Overby on November 27, 2012. This case involved the denial of Petitioner's application for an unarmed guard registration under 74C-12(a)(25) on the grounds that applicant demonstrated intemperate habits or lack of good moral character and 74C-8(d)(2) conviction of any crime involving an act of violence is prima facie evidence that the applicant does not have good moral character or temperate habits.

Administrative Law Judge Donald W. Overby proposed that the Board issue Petitioner an unarmed guard registration with one (1) year probation. Mr. Simmons was present at the Board meeting.

MOTION BY JUDGE BURRIS TO REVERSE THE BOARD'S INITIAL DECISION AND GRANT THE APPLICANT'S UNARMED GUARD REGISTRATION; SECONDED BY MR. BENSON; MOTION CARRIED.

Collin M. Berry 12-DOJ-06590 (attachment 15). Mr. Berry was present. This case was heard by Administrative Law Judge Beecher R. Gray on August 28, 2012. This case involved the denial of Petitioner's application for an armed guard registration permit under 74C-1 on the grounds that Petitioner showed a lack of good moral character and temperate habits as evidenced by a misdemeanor conviction for Exposing Children to Fire.

Administrative Law Judge Beecher R. Gray proposed that the Board reverse its denial of Petitioner's application for an armed guard registration. Mr. Berry was present at the Board meeting.

MOTION BY JUDGE BURRIS TO REVERSE THE BOARD'S INITIAL DECISION AND GRANT THE APPLICANT'S ARMED GUARD REGISTRATION; SECONDED BY MR. COOK; MOTION CARRIED.

Joseph T. Ferrara 12-DOJ-08309 (attachment 16). Mr. Ferrara was present. This case was heard by Administrative Law Judge Donald W. Overby on November 27, 2012. This case involved the denial of Petitioner's armed guard registration under 74C-1 based on lack of good moral character and temperate habits as evidenced by two (2) convictions for DUI and two (2) convictions for misdemeanor Disorderly Conduct in Cumberland County, State of Pennsylvania.

Administrative Law Donald W. Overby proposed that Board deny the Petitioner's application for an armed guard registration for a period of ninety (90) days from November 27, 2012 and then issue an armed guard registration with three (3) years probation with a condition Petitioner receive no further criminal charges. Mr. Ferrara was present at the Board meeting.

MOTION BY JUDGE BURRIS TO CONTINUE CASE UNTIL THE APRIL BOARD MEETING; SECONDED BY MR. MACRAE; MOTION CARRIED.

Christopher M. Gatewood 12-DOJ-09071(attachment 9). Mr. Gatewood was present. This case was heard by Administrative Law Judge Donald W. Overby on November 27, 2012. This case involved the denial of the petitioner's application for an armed guard registration based on the Petitioner's lack of moral character and temperate habits and evidenced by a misdemeanor conviction of Brandishing a Firearm in the Common Wealth of Virginia.

Administrative Law Judge Donald W. Overby proposed that the Petitioner be denied for 60 days, then issued an armed guard registration with three (3) years probation. Mr. Gatewood was present at the Board meeting.

MOTION BY JUDGE BURRIS TO UPHOLD THE BOARD'S INITIAL DECISION TO DENY HIS ARMED GUARD REGISTRATION; SECONDED BY MR. BOOTH; MOTION CARRIED.

Kenyon B. Jackson 12-DOJ-09186 (attachment 10). Mr. Jackson was not present. This case was heard by Administrative Law Judge Donald W. Overby on November 27, 2012. This case involved the denial of the petitioner's application for an armed guard registration based on the Petitioner's lack of moral character and temperate habits.

Administrative Law Judge Donald W. Overby proposed that the Petitioner's appeal be dismissed without prejudice for failure to prosecute. Mr. Jackson was not present at the Board meeting.

This case involved the denial of the petitioner's application for an unarmed registration based on the Petitioner's lack of moral character and temperate habits.

Administrative Law Judge Fred G. Morrison proposed that the Petitioner's appeal be dismissed without prejudice for failure to prosecute. Mr. Field was not present at the Board meeting.

This case involved the denial of the petitioner's application for an unarmed registration based on the Petitioner's lack of moral character and temperate habits.

Administrative Law Judge Fred G. Morrison proposed that the Petitioner's appeal be dismissed without prejudice for failure to prosecute. Mr. Young was not present at the Board meeting.

MOTION BY MR. BENSON TO APPROVE THE APPLICANT'S PRIVATE INVESTIGATOR ASSOCIATE'S LICENSE WITH ZERO HOURS; SECONDED BY MR. COBBLER; MOTION CARRIED.

Chairman Allen called the Board back into session.

Mr. Clark stated that the Screening Committee reconvened to consider the Private Investigator Associate's license of Mr. Jonathan Barham. The committee voted to approve the Private Investigator's License of Mr. Barham at zero hours.

MOTION BY MR. BOOTH TO ACCEPT THE RECOMMENDATION BY THE SCREENING COMMITTEE; SECONDED BY MR. GRAHAM; MOTION CARRIED.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Director Terry Wright presented the report. The current PPS budget as of January 31, 2013, has a balance of \$831,329.99; the Education Fund balance is \$60,773.30. As of February 15, 2013, the total registrations for PPS is 18,315, 1,772 licensees, and 618 certifications.

Director Terry Wright noted that there have been a total of 2,374 various correspondences printed from the PPS database, 4,177 registration cards have been printed and a total of 4,656 applications received since the last Board meeting.

MOTION BY MR. BENSON TO ACCEPT THE DIRECTOR'S REPORT; SECONDED BY MR. CLARK; MOTION CARRIED.

ATTORNEY'S REPORT:

Attorney Gray discussed the following:

I. CONSENT AGREEMENT, SETTLEMENT AGREEMENTS & CIVIL PENALTIES

- 1. Roger Lee Ladd, N.C. Detective Agency, Inc. Consent Agreement in the amount of \$2,631.60 has been paid in full.
- 2. Cleveland Lamar Bridges, American Citadel Guards, Inc. Consent Agreement in the amount of \$7,711.20 has been paid in full.

- 3. Robin Brewer Johnson, Imperial Guard and Detective Service, Inc. Consent Agreement in the amount of \$9,628.80 has been paid in full.
- 4. Stephen Anthony Tarsitano/Crime Prevention Security Patrol. On October 25, 2012 the Private Protective Services Board voted to enter into a consent agreement with Mr. Tarsitano in the amount of \$489.00 for 4 unarmed registration violations. The payment has not been received.
- 5. Lewis Glover, Jr./Knight Protective Services, Inc. On October 25, 2012 the Private Protective Services Board voted to enter into a consent agreement with Mr. Glover in the amount of \$1,288.20 for 8 unarmed and 2 armed registration violations. The payment has not been received.

II. RULES

- 1. The following rule changes that were considered and approved by the Rules Review Commission at its December 20, 2012 meeting and are now effective:
 - Adoption: 12 NCAC 07D .0014, .1401 through .1407, .1501 through .1507 and .0912;
 - Amendment: to 12 NCAC 07D .0105, .0902, .0904, .0909, .0910, .0911 and .1106
 - Repeal: 12 NCAC 07D .1108.
- 2. The following rule changes were adopted at the December 14, 2012, Board meeting:
 - Amendment to 12 NCAC 07D .0104, .0203, .0301, .0302, .0401, .0402, .0501, .0601, .0901, .0807 and .0908.

The Notice of Text for each rule amendment was filed on February 8, 2013. The Public Hearing for these rules amendments will be held on Monday, March 25, 2013 at 2:00 p.m. at the Board's office (4901 Glenwood Avenue, Suite 200, Raleigh.)

- 3. On January 1, 2013, Attorney Gray completed and filed with the Office of State Budget and Management (OSBM) the Board's 2013 Rules Modification and Improvement Program (RMIP) Report. The final of this Report is published by April 1st of each year. (The RMIP, which was initially created through Executive Order No. 70 as part of Governor Perdue's initiative to "Set government Straight," is intended to evaluate current rules and their associated requirements to determine if any are unnecessary and report progress on these actions.)
- 4. On February 15, 2013, Attorney Gray completed and filed with the OSBM the Board's 2013 Rules with Economic Impact (REI) Report. The final of this Report is published annually by March 1st and includes (a) a summary of rules with local government impact adopted by agencies in the previous fiscal year, and (b) a schedule of rules with economic impact agencies are proposing to adopt in the following fiscal year.

III. PENDING BILLS EFFECTING PPS

Two bills have been filed in the General Assembly giving persons other than armed security guards registered pursuant to Chapter 74C the authority to be armed and provide security and protective services on educational property:

- S.B. 59, Armed Security Guards in K-12
- S.B. 27, Public School Protection/Firearms Amendments

Attorney Gray gave an overview of (S.B. 59 and S.B. 27) and their sponsors. Sheriff Epley discussed the Board possibly taking steps to allow armed guards in the school system. Mr. MacRae discussed meetings he has had with different legislators on required training for armed and unarmed security guards. Mr. MacRae further stated that many elected officials are unaware of the Private Protective Services Board to include statutes that the Board enforces. Specifically, the Board should make contact with the legislator and offer to be a resource on security related issues. Chairman Allen recommended that Attorney Gray write letters to the sponsors of these bills to let them know we are here to help.

Mr. Booth discussed company police officers in schools. Attorney Gray pointed out that company police officers are currently providing security in certain school systems in North Carolina. Mr. MacRae suggested that Attorney Gray write letters to the legislator, specifically, the sponsors of these Bills to offer our assistance. Attorney Gray stated that he would like to get approval from the Attorney General's office first.

MOTION BY MR. MACRAE TO DIRECT ATTORNEY GRAY TO WRITE LETTERS TO THE SPONSORS OF THESE BILLS OFFERING OUR ASSISTANCE. THE ATTORNEY WILL SEEK PRIOR APPROVAL FROM THE ATTORNEY GENERAL'S OFFICE; SECONDED BY MR. EPLEY; MOTION CARRIED.

Five other bills have been filed in the General Assembly affecting all occupational and professional licensing boards, including PPS.

- S.B. 32, Periodic Review and Expiration of Rules
- S.B. 33, Use of Criminal History Records by Licensing Boards
- S.B. 36, APA Technical/Clarifying Changes
- S.B. 37, PED Study Occupation Licensing Board Agency
- H.B. 74, Periodic Review and Expiration of Rules (This bill is identical to S.B. 32, except the word "substantive" modifies the word "changes" in the amendment to G.S. 150B-21.2(c)(1).

IV. LAWSUIT

Attorney Gray reported on the lawsuit filed in Mecklenburg County by Justin Sherrill Kelly against the Board, the Board's Investigator, Sarah Conner, the City of Charlotte and numerous members of the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department. Attorney Gray represented the

Board. Lauren Talley, Assistant Attorney General, represented Investigator Sarah Conner. The lawsuit was dismissed on December 21, 2012. Attorney Gray reported that the Plaintiff has refilled, but only against the City of Charlotte and certain members of the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department.

MOTION BY JUDGE BURRIS TO ACCEPT THE ATTORNEY'S REPORT; SECONDED BY MR. STEVENS; MOTION CARRIED.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Leroy Everhart, Case-Closed Investigations, asked that a subcommittee be appointed in order to streamline the licensing and application process. The committee would address the obstacles encountered during the process and recommend ways to simplify the process.

Gary Pastor, Private Eyes, suggested that there be stronger enforcement of G.S. 74C. He asked that the Board change the wording of question #1 on the registration application from "Ever been convicted of" to "ever been arrested or charged". This change may avoid future problems when trying to capture all of the applicant's criminal history.

CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Richard Allen called the April 18, 2013 Private Protective Services Board meeting to order at 9:14 a.m. Chairman Allen welcomed all guests.

GOOD OF THE ORDER:

Attorney Jeff Gray explained the State Ethics Act, which addresses the ethics of public officials. This Act states specifically that if any Board Member has any conflict of interest, potential conflict of interest, or the appearance of a conflict, he or she should remove themselves from deliberation and vote on that matter and so state on the record.

Mr. Gregory Hatten, president of the NCAPI greeted the Board and all of the guests. Mr. Hatten stated that the association completed their conference on March 26, 2013 where sixty (60) Private Investigators received Continuing Education Credit Hours. The association also visited Washington D.C. for the annual "Hit The Hill" event with federal lawmakers.

Mr. Gary Pastor addressed the Board regarding helpful ideas and possible changes. Mr. Pastor suggested that there be a change to the wording in the current PPSB Application for License or Associate License. Mr. Pastor also suggested that we look at the current policy and consider requiring armed PIA's to have liability insurance. He also suggested that we change the experience requirement for Private Investigators to three (3) years OR three thousand hours. He asked that PPS staff discuss the rule changes with Judge Burris and Attorney Jeff Gray.

SCREENING COMMITTEE REPORT:

Mr. Clark reported that the Screening Committee met on Wednesday, April 17, 2013 from 2:36 p.m. until 6:18 p.m. to review a total of 57 applications. (See report). The committee members were Mr. Clark, Mr. Benson, Mr. MacRae, Mr. Weaver, Mrs. Martin and Mr. Cobbler. Mr. Clark read the report for the record.

Mr. Clark presented the following registration report for the period of February 19, 2013 to April 15, 2013. Total registrations 3,372; armed totals were 546 of which 179 were new and 341 were renewals, 3 duplicates, and 23 reissue/dual. There were a total of 10 armed Private Investigators, 2 new Private Investigator and 8 renewals, and 3 new armed Private Investigator Associates, 1 Renewal, and 3 reissue/dual. Unarmed totals were 2,809 which included 929 new, 1,689 renewals, 140 transfers, 17 duplicates and 34 reissue/dual. Total denials were 711 of which 142

were for cause and 569 for correctable reasons. There were 625 applications approved which were previously denied for a total of 1,336 denials reviewed.

Mr. Stevens recused himself from numbers 24 and 54.

MOTION BY MR. MACRAE TO ACCEPT THE SCREENING COMMITTEE REPORT AND THE REGISTRATION REPORT; SECONDED BY JUDGE BURRIS; MOTION CARRIED.

GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE REPORT:

The committee members were Judge Burris, Mr. Booth, Mr. Cook, Mr. Epley, Mr. Graham and Mr. Stevens. Judge Burris presented the attached report. (See attachment). Mr. Benson recused himself from number 2012-PPS-042.

TRAINING & EDUCATION COMMITTEE:

Mr. Stevens advised that the Training & Education Committee met on Thursday, April 18, 2013 from 8:06 a.m. until 9:00 a.m.The committee members were Mr. Stevens, Mr. Allen, Mr. Booth, Mr. Clark, Mr. Epley, Mr. MacRae and Mr. Weaver.

Presently we have 366 certified PPS unarmed guard trainers and 107 PPS certified armed guard trainers.

Mr. Stevens brought to the Board's attention an issue industry professionals are currently encountering regarding locating enough ammunition for armed guards to qualify/re-qualify. The committee suggested the Board approve a 30 round qualification course. This course would be an option for the firearms trainer to use, instead of the current 50 round qualification course. If the trainer chooses to use the 30 round qualification course, the amount of practice rounds is reduced from 150 to 100.

Attorney Jeff Gray will coordinate with the Department of Justice to obtain permission to offer the 30 round course as an option.

MOTION BY MR. BOOTH TO APPROVE 30 ROUND QUALIFICATION COURSE AS AN OPTION FOR INSTRUCTORS AND REDUCE PRACTICE ROUNDS FROM 150 TO 100; SECONDED BY MR. WEAVER; MOTION CARRIED.

The committee also discussed the current prequalification system for an instructor course. Due to availability of courses and scheduling of firearms trainer courses, the committee suggested the Board extend the period of prequalification from 180 days to 270 days.

MOTION BY MR. BOOTH TO INSTRUCT STAFF TO EXTEND PREQUALIFICATION TO A 270 DAY TIMEFRAME; SECONDED BY MR. BENSON; MOTION CARRIED.

MOTION BY MR. MACRAE TO ACCEPT THE TRAINING AND EDUCATION REPORT; SECONDED BY MR. BOOTH; MOTION CARRIED.

GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE:

Judge Burris reported on a committee concern arising out of the Metro Police and Metro Security case. There is a risk of a security guard acting as a company police officer because of the similarity in uniform and actions.

Judge Burris also reported that the committee discussed an issue with Rule 12 NCAC 07D.0503(9) which currently requires that each chart be signed by the examinee and the examiner at the end of the test. Current polygraph technology has switched from analog to digital

tests, therefore there isn't a printed chart to sign. It is important that the Board rules reflect current practices and technology.

MOTION BY MR. STEVENS TO ACCEPT THE COMMITTEE'S REPORT; SECONDED BY MR. GRAHAM; MOTION CARRIED.

SCREENING COMMITTEE:

Mr. Clark discussed an issue that was brought to his attention on a personal level. Industry professionals have concerns with having to request permission, in writing, in order to subcontract their PIAs. Mr. Hatten addressed the Board with the same concern and stated that it would be easier to request permission through a phone call to Private Protective Services.

Chairman Allen asked that Judge Burris add this to his list of concerns, discuss with staff to determine the current definition being used, and report back to the Board.

FINAL AGENCY DECISION

Attorney Jeff Gray removed himself as counsel to the Board to present the following cases.

The Board received the official record for the following cases:

Porschea Renee Williams 12-DOJ-07549 (attachment 8). Ms. Williams was not present. This case was heard by Administrative Law Judge Beecher R. Gray on October 23, 2012. This case involved the denial of the Petitioner's application for an unarmed guard registration under 74C-12(a)(25) on the grounds that applicant demonstrated intemperate habits or lack of good moral character as evidenced by four (4) convictions of Driving While License Revoked (Cabarrus County, 08 CR 707987; Cabarrus County 09 CR 704412; Rowan County, 09 CR 005494; and Rowan County 09 CR 701583) and one (1) misdemeanor conviction of Contributing to the Delinquency of a Juvenile (Guilford County, 06 CR 096603).

Administrative Law Judge Beecher R. Gray finds that Respondent's action denying Petitioner's unarmed guard registration is supported by the evidence and is AFFIRMED.

Jovan Lamont Sears 12-DOJ-08447 (attachment 9). Mr. Sears was not present. This case was heard by Administrative Law Judge Beecher R. Gray on October 23, 2012. This case involved the denial of Petitioner's application for an unarmed guard registration under 74C-12(a)(25) on the grounds that applicant demonstrated intemperate habits or lack of good moral character as evidenced by a conviction of misdemeanor Larceny by Employee.

Administrative Law Judge Donald W. Overby proposed that the Board issue Petitioner an unarmed guard registration.

MOTION BY JUDGE BURRIS TO ACCEPT OFFICE OF ADMINISTRATIVE HEARINGS DECISION TO APPROVE THE UNARMED GUARD REGISTRATION; SECONDED BY MR. BENSON; MOTION CARRIED.

Joseph T. Ferrara 12-DOJ-8309 (attachment 10). Mr. Ferrara was not present. This case was heard by Administrative Law Judge Donald W. Overby on November 27, 2012. This case involved the denial of Petitioner's application for an armed guard registration permit under 74C-12(a)(25) on the grounds that Petitioner showed a lack of good moral character and temperate habits as evidenced by two (2) convictions for DUI and two (2) convictions for misdemeanor Disorderly Conduct in Cumberland County, State of Pennsylvania.

Administrative Law Judge Beecher R. Gray proposed that Petitioner be denied an armed guard registration for a period of 90 days from November 27, 2012, then issued an armed guard registration with three (3) years of probation with a condition he receive no further criminal charges.

MOTION BY MR. BOOTH TO ACCEPT FINDINGS OF FACT BUT NOT THE CONCLUSIONS OF LAW AND RECOMMENDED DECISION AND DENY THE ARMED GUARD REGISTRATION; SECONDED BY MR. COOK; MOTION CARRIED.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Deputy Director Anthony Bonapart read the report for the record. The current PPS budget as of March 31, 2013, has a balance of \$808,726.82; the Education Fund balance is \$61,550.67. As of April 15, 2013, the total for PPS is 18,183 registrations, 1,793 licensees, and 610 certifications.

Deputy Director Bonapart noted that there have been a total of 2,416 various correspondences printed from the PPS database, 3,270 registration cards have been printed and a total of 4,523 applications received since the last Board meeting.

Amendment to 12 NCAC 07D .0104, .0203, .0301, .0302, .0401, .0402, .0501, .0601, .0901, .0807 and .0908.

IV. PENDING BILLS EFFECTING PPS

1. The bill to amend Chapter 74C has been introduced. It is House Bill 466 and was sponsored by Representatives Allen McNeil (R.; Randolph Co.) Justin Burr (R.; Stanley Co.), Josh Dobson (R.; McDowell Co.) and Edward Hanes (R.; Forsyth Co.) (see attachment 3).

Judge Burris, and the board staff, have been actively involved with reviewing drafts and communication with the bill sponsors.

- 2. At the Board's meeting on February 21st Attorney Gray reported on two bills filed in the General Assembly giving persons other than armed security guards registered pursuant to Chapter 74C the authority to be armed and provide security and protective services on educational property:
 - S.B. 59, Armed Security Guards in K-12
 - S.B. 27, Public School Protection/Firearms Amendments

There has been no action on either of these bills.

Since that time, two more bills have been introduced with similar provisions:

- S.B. 146, Private Schools/Firearms Amendments
- H.B. 595, Goldstar Officer Program/School Volunteer

There has been no action on either of these bills.

Chairman Allen has written the sponsor of each of these bills to make them aware of the Board and the basic provisions of Chapter 74C.

3. One of a number of bills amending the firearms laws in North Carolina could potentially impact the Board. Senate Bill 342, Amend Gun Laws, amends that portion of the concealed handgun permit law which allows a State agency or unit of local government to adopt ordinances to prohibit the carrying of a concealed handgun, even with a permit, in specified areas by expanding and further defining "recreational facilities." Without an exception for registered armed security guards – such as is found in N.C.G.S. 14-269.3(4) – armed security guards could not carry concealed (and possibly even openly) on these premises (attachment 6).

At the February 21, 2013 Board meeting, the Board requested that Attorney Gray draft a letter to respective legislators to inform them that these particular bills may not be necessary.

Judge Burris Clyde Cook Richard Epley Chairman Richard Allen called the May 29, 2013 conference call for Out of State Criminal Record Check to order at 9:54 a.m. Chairman Allen explained that the purpose of the special meeting is to discuss the Criminal Record Check Subcommittee recommendation for the appointment of a vendor to conduct out of state criminal records checks.

Attorney Jeff Gray explained the State Ethics Act, which addresses the ethics of public officials. This Act states specifically that if any Board Member has any conflict of interest, potential conflict of interest, or the appearance of a conflict, he or she should remove themselves from deliberation and vote on that matter and so state on the record.

Mr. Terry Wright opened the discussion by explaining that the PPSB/ASLB Out-of-State Criminal Record Checks Subcommittee had recommended a vendor to provide both Boards with out of state criminal record checks. He stated that the Alarm System Licensing Board adopted the committee's recommendation at their May 23rd Board meeting. However, prior to forwarding the recommendation on to DOJ-Purchasing, the Private Protective Services Board needed to vote on the committee's recommendation.

Mr. Wright explained that seven (7) companies placed a bid for the contract. The subcommittee met on May 1, 2013 to review the bids and then met again on May 14, 2013 with the two (2) finalists. The subcommittee recommended that both Boards stay with their current vendor, CriminalRecordCheck.Com (CRC).

Mr. Wright reported that in the three (3) years that CRC has been the vendor for PPS, according to their representative, they have processed over 14,000 criminal record checks. Of those 14,000 only eleven (11) were challenged with only two (2) being upheld. Mr. Wright also explained how user friendly CRC's system is for applicants and that CRC was the only vendor that responded to all aspects of the Request for Proposal (RFP).

Mr. Booth asked if there was a change in cost since CRC was initially given the contract. Mr. Wright stated the committee only compared the cost of all vendors based on the current proposal and was unsure whether there was any change from CRC.com's previous proposal.

Mr. Jim Stevens asked what the price comparison was for CRC versus the other companies that submitted bids. Mr. Wright explained that the subcommittee compared prices among the seven vendors and found no significant difference in overall average prices.

Mr. Stevens stated that the subcommittee is on the right track remaining with CRC. The company provides good service and comparable prices. They have a great record, no complaints or conflicts, and have a representative present at each Board meeting.

Mr. MacRae asked what the basis was of two (2) or three (3) of the challenges. Mr. Bonapart explained the basis of one challenge. He could recall where an applicant took issue with a search being done under her maiden name.

Mr. MacRae also asked who handles the complaints and who makes the final decision. Mr. Bonapart and Mr. Wright both explained that the customer (company) works with CRC to agree on a final solution. Mr. Bonapart explained that several complaints were brought before the Board for review and decision.

Mr. Booth stated that he agreed with Mr. Stevens and that CRC has done a superb job.

Mr. Clark said that he was also in agreement and would vote to keep CRC.

MOTION BY MR. STEVENS TO ACCEPT THE SUBCOMMITTEE'S RECOMMENDATION TO STAY WITH CRIMINALRECORDCHECK.COM TO CONTINUE TO PROVIDE THE BOARD WITH ALL OUT OF STATE CRIMINAL RECORDS; SECONDED BY MR. BOOTH; MOTION CARRIED.

Mr. Gray stated that the Board was a few days too early in voting to adopt the Amendment to the Rules 12 NCAC 07D .0104, .0203, .0301, .0302, .0401, .0501, .0601, .0901, .0807 and .0908 at the April 18th Board meeting and that the Board needed to vote again to approve the rules as published.

MOTION BY MR MACRAE TO ADOPT THE AMENDMENT TO THE RULES; SECONDED BY MR. COBBLER; MOTION CARRIED.

CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Richard Allen called the June 20, 2013 Private Protective Services Board meeting to order at 9:03 a.m. Chairman Allen welcomed all guests.

GOOD OF THE ORDER:

Attorney Jeff Gray explained the State Ethics Act, which addresses the ethics of public officials. This Act states specifically that if any Board Member has any conflict of interest, potential conflict of interest, or the appearance of a conflict, he or she should remove themselves from deliberation and vote on that matter and so state on the record.

Mr. Gregory Hatten, president of the NCAPI greeted the Board and all of the guests. Mr. Hatten stated that the association was making arrangements for their fall conference scheduled for November in Greensboro. He also stated that members were working with the state legislature on issues of concern.

Ms. Ruth Reynolds also addressed the Board to inform all members of the P.I. Summit that she will be conducting with Kee Collin on August 17th and 18th at the Marriott in downtown Charlotte, North Carolina. She also stated that there would be speakers coming from all over the country.

APPROVAL OF THE APRIL 18, 2013 MEETING MINUTES.

MOTION BY MR. GRAHAM TO ACCEPT THE MINUTES; SECONDED BY MR. MACRAE; MOTION CARRIED.

SCREENING COMMITTEE REPORT:

Mrs. Martin reported that the Screening Committee met on Wednesday, June 19, 2013 from 2:06 p.m. until 4:54 p.m. to review a total of 49 applications. (See report). The committee members were Mrs. Martin, Mr. Benson, Mr. MacRae, Mr. Weaver and Mr. Cobbler. Mrs. Martin read the report for the record.

Mr. Wright presented the following registration report for the period of April 15, 2013 to June 17, 2013. Total registrations 3,902; armed totals were 651 of which 158 were new and 422 were renewals, 1 duplicate, and 70 reissue/dual. There were a total of 7 armed Private Investigators, 3 new Private Investigators and 4 renewals, 6 new armed Private Investigator Associates, and 2 Renewals. Unarmed totals were 3,236 which included 1,065 new, 1,897 renewals, 175 transfers, 9 duplicates and 90 reissue/dual. Total denials were 642 of which 152 were for cause and 490 for correctable reasons. There were 763 applications approved which were previously denied for a total of 1,405 denials reviewed.

MOTION BY MR. BOOTH TO ACCEPT THE SCREENING COMMITTEE REPORT AND THE REGISTRATION REPORT; SECONDED BY MR. BENSON; MOTION CARRIED.

GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE REPORT:

Judge Burris reported the Grievance Committee met on Wednesday, June 19, 2013 from 8:06 a.m. until 12:06 p.m. and heard a total of 7 cases. The committee members were Judge Burris, Mr. Booth, Mr. Cook, Mr. Epley, Mr. Graham and Mr. Stevens. Judge Burris presented the attached report. (See attachment). Mr. Epley recused himself from case 2013-PPS-009.

MOTION BY MR. BOOTH TO ACCEPT THE GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE REPORT; SECONDED BY MR. STEVENS; MOTION CARRIED.

TRAINING & EDUCATION COMMITTEE:

Mr. Stevens advised that the Training & Education Committee met on Thursday, June 20, 2013 from 8:06 a.m. until 9:00 a.m. The committee members were Mr. Stevens, Mr. Allen, Mr. Booth, Mr. Clark, Mr. Epley, Mr. MacRae and Mr. Weaver. Mr. Stevens requested that PPS Field Services Supervisor Phillip Stephenson read the report. Mr. Stephenson provided the following updates:

Presently we have 366 certified PPS unarmed guard trainers and 99 PPS certified armed guard trainers.

The following PPS Training Courses for CEU Credits have been scheduled:

July 31, 2013 9 am - 1 pm Charlotte August 22, 2013 1 pm - 5 pm Asheville December 21, 2013 1 pm - 5 pm Raleigh

Mr. Epley suggested that we change the number of credit hours for attending Board meetings from one (1) to two (2) hours for a maximum of four (4) hours per year. After discussing the issue, the Board's attorney was directed to initiate the rule change. Tentative effective date is January 1, 2014.

MOTION BY MR. BENSON TO ACCEPT THE RULE CHANGE TOO GRANT TWO (2) HOURS OF CE CREDIT FOR ATTENDING BOARD MEETINGS; SECONDED BY MR. BOOTH; MOTION CARRIED.

Mr. Stevens stated that the following twelve (12) continuing education training courses have been submitted for approval: Non Violent Crisis Intervention (8), Active Shooter Training (12), Tradecraft for Asset Handlers (6), Specialized Interviewing Techniques for Children and Families (4), Understanding Domestic Violence (2), Crime Awareness & Personal Protection (2),

Defending our Homeland: A Private Investigator's Perspective on Homeland Security (online) (2), Defending our Homeland: A Private Investigator's Perspective on Homeland Security (2), Electronic Countermeasures (4), Analytical Interview System (12), Computer Voice Stress Analyzer (CVSA) Recertification Course (12) and Police/Security Bicycle Patrol (12).

MOTION BY MR. BOOTH TO APPROVE THE ABOVE COURSES FOR CONTINUING EDUCATION TRAINING; SECONDED BY MR. EPLEY; MOTION CARRIED.

MOTION BY MR. WEAVER TO ACCEPT THE TRAINING AND EDUCATION COMMITTEE REPORT; SECONDED BY MRS. MARTIN; MOTION CARRIED.

GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE:

Judge Burris discussed the issue of when it is acceptable to publish a disciplinary action. There has been discussion as to whether it is appropriate to publish the grievance report after the Board meeting or should individuals who have the right to appeal the Board's decision only have their rulings listed on the web once all the appeals have been exhausted. This issue will be deferred until the August Board meeting.

Judge Burris also reported that there will be a change to the audit process regarding late unarmed registration renewals. Effective immediately, if the unarmed late fee has been paid the registration will be considered on time and will not be reported as a violation upon conducting an audit. This policy change will not be retroactive.

MOTION BY MR. BOOTH TO ACCEPT THE COMMITTEE'S REPORT; SECONDED BY MR. MACRAE; MOTION CARRIED.

SCREENING COMMITTEE:

On October 24, 2012 the Private Protective Services Board approved the Private Investigator License of Mr. Ordie Hazu McFarland Jr. with the condition that staff conduct a compliance review of his work and report back to the Board in six months.

Mr. McFarland's performance review will be deferred to the December Board meeting due to illness. Mr. MacRae recused himself from consideration of this matter.

MOTION BY MR. BENSON TO DEFER REVIEW TO DECEMBER MEETING; SECONDED BY MR. BOOTH; MOTION CARRIED.

Mr. Bonapart read the official response to a letter submitted by industry member Gary Pastor, Private Eyes, Inc., regarding Armed Private Investigator Associates being required to have liability insurance. Board members discussed whether or not a PIA is considered a licensee. It was determined that a PIA should not be classified any differently than any other armed licensee or registrant for the purposes of liability insurance.

MOTION BY JUDGE BURRIS THAT A PIA BE CLASSIFIED AS A LICENSEE; SECONDED BY MR. BENSON; MOTION CARRIED.

Mr. Wright suggested that on the issue of whether or not an armed PIA or just the sponsor is responsible for carrying liability insurance be deferred to staff and the Board attorney until the August Board meeting. The Board stated until that time the current practice will stay in place.

The Board also reviewed a new question that will be added to PPS applications to provide applicants with a clearer understanding of Prayer for Judgments. The question will read:

Have you ever pled guilty, been granted a Prayer for Judgment or been convicted of any crime (Felony or Misdemeanor)?

MOTION BY MR. BENSON TO INSERT THE NEW QUESTION ON ALL APPLICATIONS; SECONDED BY MR. MACRAE; MOTION CARRIED.

74C REWRITE COMMITTEE REPORT:

Judge Burris reported on the status of House Bill 466 (amendments to Chapter 74C). Representatives Burr and McNeil sponsored the Bill. The Bill passed the House on April 25th. The Bill was forwarded to the Senate and is currently in the Judiciary I Committee.

Attorney Jeff Gray removed himself as counsel to the Board to present the following cases.

The Board received the official record for the following cases:

Jowan E. Smith 12-DOJ-09950 (attachment 7). Mr. Smith was present. This case was heard by Administrative Law Judge Donald W. Overby on December 11, 2012. This case involved the denial of the Petitioner's application for an unarmed guard registration under G.S. 74C-12(a)(25) on the grounds that applicant demonstrated intemperate habits or lack of good moral character as evidenced by conviction of misdemeanor Possession of Drug Paraphernalia and misdemeanor Possession of Marijuana, ½ to 1½ ounce.

Administrative Law Judge Donald W. Overby finds that Petitioner be denied for a period of 30 days, then issued an unarmed guard registration with twelve months probation.

MOTION BY JUDGE BURRIS TO REVERSE THE BOARD'S INITIAL DECISION AND GRANT THE APPLICANT'S UNARMED REGISTRATION; SECONDED BY MR. COBBLER; MOTION CARRIED.

Eddie Hugh Hardison 13-DOJ-08765 (attachment 4). Mr. Hardison was present. This case was heard by Senior Administrative Law Judge Fred G. Morrison, Jr. on March 26, 2013. This case involved the denial of Petitioner's renewal application for an unarmed guard registration under G.S. 74C-12(a)(25) on the grounds that applicant demonstrated intemperate habits or lack of good moral character as evidenced by Petitioner received a PJC upon payment of costs in a misdemeanor Assault on a Female case.

Senior Administrative Law Judge Fred G. Morrison, Jr. proposed that the Board reverse its initial decision to deny Petitioner's renewal application for unarmed security guard registration.

Chairman Allen recused himself.

MOTION BY MR. MACRAE TO REVERSE THE BOARD'S INITIAL DECISION AND GRANT THE APPLICANT'S UNARMED REGISTRATION; SECONDED BY MR. BENSON; MOTION CARRIED.

Reginald E. James 12-DOJ-8195 (attachment 3). Mr. James was present. This case was heard by Senior Administrative Law Judge Fred G. Morrison, Jr. on October 23, 2012. This case involved the denial of Petitioner's application for an unarmed guard registration permit under G.S.74C-12(a)(25) on the grounds that Petitioner showed a lack of good moral character and temperate habits as evidenced by Petitioner's criminal record.

Senior Administrative Law Judge Fred G. Morrison, Jr. proposed that the Board reverse its denial of Petitioner's application for an unarmed guard registration permit.

MOTION BY MR. BENSON TO REVERSE THE BOARD'S INITIAL DECISION AND GRANT THE APPLICANT'S UNARMED REGISTRATION; SECONDED BY MR. WEAVER; MOTION CARRIED.

Seelam T. Jones 12-DOJ-09951 (attachment 5). Mr. Jones was not present. This case was heard by Administrative Law Judge Donald W. Overby on December 11, 2012. This case involved the denial of Petitioner's application for an unarmed guard registration permit under G.S. 74C-12(a)(25) on the grounds that Petitioner showed a lack of good moral character and temperate habits as evidenced by multiple felony and misdemeanor convictions in the State of South Carolina.

Administrative Law Judge Donald W. Overby recommends that Petitioner be denied an unarmed guard registration for a period of one (1) year.

MOTION BY MR. WEAVER TO DENY THE APPLICANT'S UNARMED REGISTRATION; SECONDED BY MR. BENSON; MOTION CARRIED.

Steven C. Vorse 12-DOJ-06060 (attachment 6). Mr. Vorse was not present. On October 23, 2012 this case was heard by Administrative Law Judge Beecher R. Gray. Judge Gray recommended that the Petitioner's appeal is dismissed without prejudice for failure to prosecute.

MOTION BY JUDGE BURRIS TO ACCEPT THE DISMISSAL; SECONDED BY MR. BENSON; MOTION CARRIED.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Director Wright reported that an amendment was warranted to the Screening report. Christopher Lee Amburn (#5) was recommended for full PI license, the Screening report incorrectly reads PIA.

MOTION BY MR. BOOTH TO APPROVE APPLICANT FOR FULL LICENSE; SECONDED BY MR. BENSON; MOTION CARRIED.

Director Terry Wright read the report for the record. The current PPS budget as of April 30, 2013, has a balance of \$838,696.99; the Education Fund balance is \$61,725.45. As of June 17, 2013, the total for PPS is 18,217 registrations, 1,807 licensees, and 597 certifications.

Mr. Wright noted that there have been a total of 2,234 various correspondences printed from the PPS database, 4,950 registration cards have been printed and a total of 5,242 applications received since the last Board meeting.

Mr. Booth asked about the status of the new computer system. Mr. Wright advised that the new system was at the State IT Level.

MOTION BY MR. STEVENS TO ACCEPT THE DIRECTOR'S REPORT; SECONDED BY MR. BOOTH; MOTION CARRIED.

Mr. Wright advised the Board that there has been a change in the type of information that staff can provide licensees when criminal charges/convictions are listed on the FBI report and no other public document. If criminal convictions are only listed on the FBI report, staff is prohibited from informing anyone other than the applicant of the convictions. Mr. Wright advised that a memo will be sent to the industry once the new process has been approved by the State Bureau of Investigation (SBI). Mr. Wright also requested that the Board form a subcommittee to establish standards for acceptance of the on-line North Carolina Criminal Record Checks provided by vendors via the North Carolina Administrative Office of the Courts.

Chairman Allen appointed Mr. Booth, Mr. Weaver, and Mrs. Martin to this subcommittee.

ATTORNEY'S REPORT:

Attorney Gray discussed the following:

I. CONSENT AGREEMENT, SETTLEMENT AGREEMENTS & CIVIL PENALTIES

1. Stephen Anthony Tarsitano/Crime Prevention Security Patrol. On October 25, 2012, the Private Protective Services Board voted to enter into a consent agreement with Mr. Tarsitano in the amount of \$489.00 for 4 unarmed registration violations. The payment has not been received.

- 2. Lewis Glover, Jr./Knight Protective Services, Inc. On October 25, 2012, the Private Protective Services Board voted to enter into a consent agreement in the amount of \$1,288.20 for 8 unarmed and 2 armed registration violations. The payment has not been received.
- 3. Bruce Vernon Seibert/Defender Services Inc. Consent Agreement in the amount of \$8,200.80 has been paid in full.
- 4. Brian Joseph White/Eagle Eye Security. On April 18, 2013, the Private Protective Services Board voted to enter into a consent agreement in the amount of \$3,916.80 in two (2) monthly installments. First payment received on June 3, 2013, in the amount of \$2,000.00.

III. RULES

- 1. Mr. Gray stated that the below rules changes were adopted at the April 18, 2013, Board meeting. Due to an error in calculating the Public Comment period, Mr. Gray advised that he had obtained the Board's approval too soon. They were "re-adopted" at the special Board meeting via telephone conference call on May 29, 2013.
 - Amendment to 12 NCAC 07D .0104, .0203, .0301, .0302, .0401, .0402, .0501, .0601, .0901, .0807 and .0908.
- 2. The G.S. 150B-19.1 Certification forms for the following rules changes were submitted to the Rules Review Commission on May 16, 2013:
 - Amendment to 12 NCAC 07D .0501, .0502, .0503 and .0504.

IV. PENDING BILLS EFFECTING PPS

- 1. House Bill 466, the bill to amend Chapter 74C, passed the House on April 25, 2013. It was referred to the Senate Committee on Judiciary I on April 29, 2013, with a serial referral to the Finance Committee upon a Favorable Report. Sponsored by Representatives Allen McNeill (R.; Randolph Co.) Justin Burr (R.; Stanly Co.), Josh Dobson (R.; McDowell Co.) and Edward Hanes (R.; Rosyth Co.), the bill appears to have no opposition and has not been amended.
 - Judge Burris, and the Board staff, have been actively involved with communicating with the bill sponsors, as well as supporters in the Senate.
- 2. At the Board's meeting on April 18th Mr. Gray advised that he had reported on four bills filed in the General Assembly giving persons other than armed security guards registered pursuant to Chapter 74C the authority to be armed and provide security and protective services on educational property:
 - S.B. 59, Armed Security Guards in K-12
 - S.B. 27, Public School Protection/Firearms Amendments
 - S.B. 146, Private Schools/Firearms Amendments
 - H.B. 595, Goldstar Officer Program/School Volunteer

There has been no action on these bills.

Chairman Allen has written the sponsors of each of these bills to make them aware of the Board and the basic provisions of Chapter 74C.

3. One of a number of bills amending the firearms laws in North Carolina could potentially impact the Board. Senate Bill 342, Amend Gun Laws, amends that portion

of the concealed handgun permit law which allows a State agency or unit of local government to adopt ordinances to prohibit the carrying of a concealed handgun, even with a permit, in specified areas by expanding and further defining "recreational facilities." Without an exception for registered armed security guards – such as is found in N.C.G.S. 14-269.3(4) – armed security guards could not carry concealed (and possibly even openly) on these premises.

Another firearms related bill has seen a lot of action over the past two weeks, House Bill 937, "Amend Various Firearms Laws," which had passed the House on May 7, 2013, was basically rewritten in the Senate Judiciary Committee on June 11, 2013. This omnibus bill would now expand places where holders of a concealed handgun permit may take a handgun and would add penalties for use of any gun in committing a crime. The Senate version of the bill would make further changes, including eliminating pistol purchase permits. Currently, a handgun buyer must get a purchase permit from a sheriff or hold a concealed handgun permit, which requires a background check. Under the Senate's revision to the bill, a concealed handgun permit or a criminal background check would be needed to buy a handgun from a licensed dealer, but private sales of handguns, as often occur at gun shows, would no longer require a purchase permit and no background check would be needed. The Senate bill would clarify current law to say concealed handgun permit holders may carry on trails and other recreation areas, as well as in playgrounds. Cities would be able to ban handguns from athletic events. The new bill also would extend the rights of concealed handgun permit holders to lock their guns in their cars on all educational properties, including colleges and public school campuses, although private schools would be able to opt out.

A provision in the Senate bill was added that would close the records of those with concealed handgun permits from public view. That information now is public record.

Current law prohibits carrying firearms at parades and funeral processions, but the Senate bill would lift that prohibition for concealed handgun permit holders. Judges, registers of deeds, clerks of court and magistrates who hold concealed handgun permits would be able to take their firearms into a courthouse, a privilege that currently extends only to district attorneys.

The Senate bill also would allow hunting with noise suppressors and add penalties for concealed handgun permit holders who violate permit rules, such as carrying a handgun after having consumed alcohol.

Police chiefs from UNC system campuses and others expressed opposition. The N.C. Sheriff's Association backed the changes in the bill that strengthened background checks for those with mental health problems and that increased penalties for gun crimes. The Senate sponsor of the measure, Sen. Buck Newton, (R., Wilson Co.), received support from Grass Roots North Carolina and the N.C. Pistol and Rifle Association.

- 4. At the April meeting Mr. Gray reported that five bills have been filed in the General Assembly affecting all occupational and professional licensing boards, including the PPSB. The status of the bills is as follows:
 - SB 32, Periodic Review and Expiration of Rules Re-referred to Committee on Program Evaluation 5/14/13.
 - SB 33, Use of Criminal History Records by Licensing Boards Signed by Governor 4/9/13 (see attachment 2)
 - SB 36, APA Technical/Clarifying Changes (This bill is identical to HB 165.) SB 36 passed Senate, then House with amendments; failed to pass Senate; Conference Committee appointed 4/24/13. (No action on HB 165.)
 - SB 37, PED Study Occupational Licensing Board Agency (This bill is identical to HB 166.) No action on either bill.
 - HB 74, Periodic Review and Expiration of Rules (This bill is identical to SB 34, except the word "substantive" modifies the word "changes" in the amendment to G.S. 150B-21.2(c) (1).) HB 74 passed House; referred to Senate Rules Committee. (No action on SB 34.)

The Board discussed the issue of applicants providing false information to the Boards vendor that provides criminal record checks. The CRC is eventually submitted to the Board. The Board recommended that there should be a penalty for providing false information to the Board's CRC vendor. The Board recommended that attorney Gray draft a change to the administrative rules specifying that submitting false information to the Board's CRC vendor is a violation.

MOTION BY MR. BENSON TO ACCEPT RECOMMENDATION; SECONDED BY MR. MACRAE; MOTION CARRIED.

Attorney Gray updated the Board on the investigation of Mr. William Hagler, who may be charged with Obtaining Property by False Pretense. The Board has a temporary restraining order against Mr. Hagler. A preliminary injunction hearing will be heard before the judge on June 24, 2013.

Attorney Gray also informed the Board that a new retainer agreement needs to be signed because the agreement must be in the law office's name and include a new cap on travel expenses.

Director Terry Wright called the July 25, 2013 special committee meeting to order and explained that the Private Protective Services Board and Alarm Systems Licensing Board need to discuss a process to ensure that all criminal records provided by vendors meet the same standards.

PPS Registration Supervisor, Mrs. Shannon Thongkheuang opened the discussion by explaining the purpose of the special meeting. Mrs. Thongkheuang stated that staff members receive North Carolina on-line criminal record checks from approximately

thirty different AOC vendors. The information listed on the actual criminal record varies depending on the vendor. Staff has received some record checks that are missing pages or just include the name of licensee/applicant, date of birth, and simply state, "No Record Found".

After much discussion about the process to include how searches are conducted, who conducts searches and PPS documents submitted with the CRC, the committee decided that there should be one format for all AOC vendors.

The committee requested that staff revise the current Certification of Criminal Record Review form that is used by licensees to certify that they have reviewed the applicant's criminal record. The form will be revised to include recommendations made by the committee. The form will be forwarded to the committee members for review. After all changes have been made, the committee members will present the form to their respective Board for approval.

The committee will recommend to their respective Boards that the updated Certification of Criminal Record Review form be made a mandatory part of the CRC submission process. The form will be signed by the licensee certifying that the CRC belongs to his or her applicant. The committee will also recommend that specific mandatory queries be added to the criminal record check itself. All AOC vendors will be required to document on the criminal record that the queries were run.

Meeting adjourned at 12:30 p.m.

CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Richard Allen called the August 22, 2013 Private Protective Services Board meeting to order at 9:02 a.m. Chairman Allen welcomed all guests.

GOOD OF THE ORDER:

Attorney Jeff Gray explained the State Ethics Act, which addresses the ethics of public officials. This Act states specifically that if any Board Member has any conflict of interest, potential conflict of interest, or the appearance of a conflict, he or she should recuse themself from deliberation and vote on that matter and so state on the record.

SCREENING COMMITTEE REPORT:

Mrs. Martin reported that the Screening Committee met on Wednesday, August 21, 2013 from 2:00 p.m. until 5:10 p.m. to review a total of 46 applications. (See report). The committee members were Mr. MacRae, Mr. Weaver, Mrs. Martin and Mr. Cobbler. Mrs. Martin read the report for the record.

Mr. Bonapart presented the following registration report for the period of June 17, 2013 to August 19, 2013. Total registrations 4,268; armed totals were 690 of which 216 were new and 383 were renewals, 2 duplicates, and 89 reissue/dual. There were a total of 9 armed Private Investigators, 4 new Private Investigators and 5 renewals, 3 new armed Private Investigator Associates, and 4 Renewals. Unarmed totals were 3,562 which included 1,293 new, 2,036 renewals, 65 transfers, 15 duplicates and 153 reissue/dual. Total denials were 676 of which 189 were for cause and 487 for correctable reasons. There were 669 applications approved which were previously denied for a total of 1,345 denials reviewed.

Mrs. Martin recused herself from numbers 14 and 15. Mr. Weaver recused himself from number 30.

(see Memo) He also informed the board that there will be a kickoff meeting for the new database on August 27, 2013 where the timeframe will be discussed. The Chairman of the Finance Committee would also be present at this meeting via teleconference.

Ruth Reynolds asked that Mr. Bonapart to explain the new database system for those industry members who are unfamiliar with it. Mr. Bonapart explained that the system will allow the Qualifying Agent (QA) to submit applications electronically. The system's structure will guide the QA through the application process and calculate fees. The QA will be able to query his/her roster in real time. Once implemented the new system will dramatically reduce denials and allow PPS staff to spend more time approving applications than creating denial letters for missing information.

Chairman Allen recommended that all new chairpersons reach out to those members who have previously held the position for insight on their duties.

FINAL AGENCY DECISION

Attorney Jeff Gray removed himself as counsel to the Board to present the following cases.

The Board received the official record for the following cases:

Cameron Imhotep Clinkscale 13-DOJ-05095 (attachment 6). Mr. Clinkscale was not present. This case was heard by Administrative Law Judge Gene Cella on February 26, 2013. This case involved the denial of the Petitioner's application for an unarmed guard registration under 74C-12(a)(25) on the grounds that applicant demonstrated intemperate habits or lack of good moral character as evidenced by two (2) convictions of misdemeanor Disorderly Conduct in the State of Ohio.

Administrative Law Judge Gene Cella found that Petitioner presented evidence sufficient to explain the factual basis for the charge, had rebutted the presumption, and recommended that Petitioner be issued an unarmed guard registration.

MOTION BY JUDGE BURRIS TO ACCEPT THE PROPOSED DECISION TO GRANT PETITIONER AN UNARMED GUARD REGISTRATION; SECONDED BY MR. COBBLER; MOTION CARRIED.

Jerome Douglas Mayfield 13-DOJ-04393 (attachment 6). Mr. Mayfield was not present. This case was heard by Administrative Law Judge Gene Cella on February 26, 2012. This case involved the summary suspension of Petitioner's armed guard registration and the denial of Petitioner's application for an unarmed guard registration under 74C-12(a)(25) on the grounds that applicant demonstrated intemperate habits or lack of good moral character as evidenced by a conviction of misdemeanor Assault Inflicting Serious Injury and misdemeanor Assault with a Deadly Weapon.

Administrative Law Judge Gene Cella recommended that the summary suspension of Petitioner's armed guard registration be lifted and Petitioner's application for unarmed guard registration be approved.

MOTION BY MR. WEAVER TO CONTINTUE TO DENY REGISTRATION; SECONDED BY MR. COOK; SIX (6) OPPOSE; MOTION FAILS. MOTION BY MRS. MARTIN TO ACCEPT DECISION AND GRANT PETITIONER REGISTRATION; SECONDED BY MR. BOOTH; TWO (2) OPPOSE; MOTION CARRIED.

On the issue of the consent agreement regarding Robert McCrory for not properly registering guards, it was proposed that Mr. McCrory enter into a consent agreement totaling \$10,098.00 to be paid in six (6) installments.

MOTION BY MR. BOOTH TO ACCEPT THE PROPOSED CONSENT AGREEMENT; SECONDED BY MR. WEAVER; MOTION CARRIED.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Deputy Director Anthony Bonapart read the report for the record. The current PPS budget as of May 31, 2013, has a balance of \$837,416.79; the Education Fund balance is \$63,047.43. As of August 16, 2013, the total registrations for PPS is 18,303, 1,809 licensees, and 596 certifications.

Deputy Director Bonapart noted that there have been a total of 2,416 various correspondences printed from the PPS database, 4,361 registration cards have been printed and a total of 4,523 applications received since the last Board meeting.

Mr. Booth inquired about the current backlog for registration. Mr. Bonapart reported that staff has processed unarmed guard registrations up to July 1, 2013. Armed registrations have been processed up to August 12, 2013.

Mr. Bonapart reported on the upcoming IASIR Conference scheduled for November 13-15, 2013 in Quebec Canada. He asked if the Board intended to send representatives to the conference. The Board discussed the conference and funding. After much discussion the Board decided not to attend the 2013 conference.

MOTION BY MR. BOOTH TO NOT ATTEND THE 2013 IASIR CONFERENCE BUT TO SUPPORT THE CONFERENCE WHEN IT IS HELD CLOSER TO NORTH CAROLINA WHERE PRICES MAY BE CHEAPER; SECONDED BY MR. COOK; MOTION CARRIED.

Mr. Bonapart also reported that IT was offering a Business Analysis Boot Camp regarding the new database system. He would like to send the registration supervisor, Mrs. Shannon Thongkheuang to the course. Mr. MacRae expressed concerns about PPS paying extra money for training. Judge Burris stated that he feared that if PPS did not take the class it may delay the project as a whole.

MOTION BY JUDGE BURRIS TO APPROVE SENDING STAFF TO THE TRAINING CLASS; SECONDED BY MR. BOOTH; MOTION CARRIED.

Mr. Bonapart asked the Board to consider whether or not it should be mandatory for applicants to apply online when the new database in fully functional. The Board decided that it would be best to place that question on hold until closer to bringing the new database on-line. The Board members would need time to assess how everything will work.

Mr. Bonapart asked the Board whether forms that require notarization would be accepted online with an electronic signature. After a brief discussion the Board decided that an electronic signature is acceptable.

Mr. Bonapart presented the registration and licensing appeals report covering the period July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013. This is the second year the Board has received the report. The statistics show that the process is fair and a petitioner's chance of prevailing improves as he/she moves through the appeals system.

ATTORNEY'S REPORT:

Attorney Gray discussed the following:

I. CONSENT AGREEMENT, SETTLEMENT AGREEMENTS & CIVIL PENALTIES

- 1. Stephen Anthony Tarsitano/Crime Prevention Security Patrol. On October 25, 2012, the Private Protective Services Board voted to enter into a consent agreement with Mr. Tarsitano in the amount of \$489.00 for 4 unarmed registration violations. Paid in full.
- 2. Lewis Glover, Jr./Knight Protective Services, Inc. On October 25, 2012, the Private Protective Services Board voted to enter into a consent agreement in the amount of \$1,288.20 for 8 unarmed and 2 armed registration violations. The payment has not been received.
- 3. Mr. Kenneth Wayne Berg/Garda CL, Inc. On June 20, 2013, the Private Protective Services Board voted to enter into a consent agreement with Mr. Berg in the amount of \$6,793.20 for 37 armed registration violations. The payment has not been received.
- 4. Jay Jay Miller/Landmark Security, Inc. Board voted to enter into a consent agreement in the amount of \$4,096.32 in three monthly installments for 42 unarmed registration violations. First payment received on 8/12/2013 (\$1,365.44).
- 5. Pamela Webb Mayfield/United Security. On June 20, 2013, the Private Protective Services Board voted to enter into a consent agreement in the amount of \$3,855.60 for 32 unarmed registration violations. Paid in full.

III. RULES

- 1. The below rules changes were "re-adopted" at the special Board meeting via telephone conference call on May 29, 2013.
 - Amendment to 12 NCAC 07D .0104, .0203, .0301, .0302, .0401, .0402, .0501, .0601, .0901, .0807 and .0908.

At its July 18, 2013, the Rules Review Commission objected to the Board's proposed amendments to 12 NCAC 07D .0301, .0302, .0401, .0501, .0601, .0807, .0901 and .0909 which were amended to comply with the new law regarding acceptance of military occupational specialty for purposes of licensure for former members of the armed forces and easing the licensure requirements for spouses of active duty military on the grounds of a lack of statutory authority as to requiring military spouses to have a license or experience.

- 2. The G.S. 150B-19.1 Certification forms for the following rules changes were submitted to the Rules Review Commission on May 16, 2013.
 - Amendment to 12 NCAC 07D.0501, .0502, .0503 and .0504.
- 3. At the Board's June 20, 2013 meeting, a motion was made to change the number of credit hours for attending Board meetings from one (1) to two (2) hours for a maximum of four (4) hours per year. This will necessitate a rule amendment and Attorney Gray was requested to prepare it. Also, at the same meeting the Board agreed to the staff's

suggestion that in light of the recent practice of relying on third-party criminal history records checks there should be a penalty for providing false information equal to that of providing it to the Board directly. This, too, necessitates a rule amendment.

IV. PENDING BILLS EFFECTING PPS

1. House Bill 466, the bill to amend Chapter 74C, passed the House on April 25, 2013. It was referred to the Senate Committee on Judiciary I on April 29, 2013, with a serial referral to the Finance Committee upon a Favorable Report. Sponsored by Representatives Allen McNeill (R.; Randolph Co.) Justin Burr (R.; Stanley Co.), Josh Dobson (R.; McDowell Co.) and Edward Hanes (R.; Forsyth Co.), the bill appeared to have no opposition, was not amended, but failed to pass the Senate. Having passed the House in the "long" Session it is eligible for consideration in the "short" session which convenes May 2014.

Judge Burris and the Board staff were very actively involved with communicating with the bill sponsors, as well as supporters in the Senate.

- 2. At the Board's meeting on April 18th Attorney Gray reported on four bills filed in the General Assembly giving persons other than armed security guards registered pursuant to Chapter 74C the authority to be armed and provide security and protective services on educational property:
 - S.B. 59, Armed Security Guards in K-12
 - S.B. 27, Public School Protection/Firearms Amendments
 - S.B. 146, Private Schools/Firearms Amendments
 - H.B. 595, Goldstar Officer Program/School Volunteer

None of these bills passed either chamber of the Legislature.

Chairman Allen had written the sponsors of each of these bills to make them aware of the Board and the basic provisions of Chapter 74C.

3. One of a number of bills amending the firearms laws in North Carolina could potentially impact the Board. Senate Bill 342, Amend Gun Laws, amends that portion of the concealed handgun permit law which allows a State agency or unit of local government to adopt ordinances to prohibit the carrying of a concealed handgun, even with a permit, in specified areas by expanding and further defining "recreational facilities." Without an exception for registered armed security guards – such as is found in N.C.G.S. 14-269.3(4) – armed security guards could not carry concealed (and possibly even openly) on these premises. The bill did not pass either chamber of the Legislature, however, this same provision was included in House Bill 937, below.

- 4. House Bill 937, "Amend Various Firearms Laws," was ratified by the Legislature on July 24, 2013, and signed by the Governor on July 29th. It contains the following pertinent provisions.
 - The bill expands the list of individuals in N.C.G.S. 14-269(b) who are exempt from the general prohibition on carrying a concealed weapon. The list now includes qualified retired law enforcement officers under H.R. 218 (the Law Enforcement Officers Safety Act of 2004), North Carolina judges and magistrates with concealed handgun permits, and North Carolina elected clerks of court and register of deeds with concealed handgun permits.
 - N.C.G.S. 14-415.21 is modified to increase the penalty for a concealed handgun permittee who is carrying a concealed handgun in a posted area or after consuming alcohol from a Class 2 to a Class 1 misdemeanor.
 - The bill clarifies what areas may be posted by units of local government. Units of local government may post recreational facilities as off limits to carrying a concealed handgun. The term "recreational facility" is defined as an athletic field and its appurtenant facilities, such as restrooms during an organized athletic event; a swimming pool, including any appurtenant facilities used for dressing or storage of personal items; and any facilities used for athletic events such as a gymnasium. The term "recreational facility" specifically does not include a greenway, designated biking or walking path, or an area customarily used as such although not specifically designated as one. No exemption was made for armed security guards.
 - Lists of individuals issued concealed handgun permits will no longer be a public record, although the information would be available upon request to State and local law enforcement agencies.
 - The bill modifies N.C.G.S. 14-269.2 and expands the list of individuals who may possess a handgun on institutions of higher education, non-public post-secondary educational institutions, or public or non-public schools. Employees of any of these institutions who live on the campus will be allowed to possess the handgun at the employee's residence or in the employee's vehicle being driven to or from campus, except non-public schools may still prohibit the possession of a handgun by these employees. Any individual with a valid concealed handgun permit, or who is exempt from obtaining a permit, may leave the handgun in a closed (locked or unlocked) compartment in the person's locked vehicle or leave the handgun in a locked container securely affixed to the vehicle while on campus.
 - N.C.G.S. 12-269.3 is modified to allow persons with a concealed handgun permit, or who are exempt from obtaining a permit, to carry a concealed handgun into any assembly where a fee is charged for admission or an establishment where alcoholic beverages are sold and consumed so long as the premises has not been posted prohibiting the carrying of concealed handguns.

- N.C.G.S. 14-277.2 is modified to allow persons with concealed handgun permits to participate in or be present at parades or funeral processions with a concealed handgun unless the premises have been posted prohibiting the carrying of concealed handguns.
- N.C.G.S. 15A-1340.16A is modified to provide for enhanced sentences if a defendant is convicted of a class A, B1, B2, C, D or E felony and the defendant used, displayed, or threatened to use or display a firearm or deadly weapon during the commission of the felony.

The bill also makes numerous modifications to the pistol purchase permit laws. Among these changes, if a sheriff denies a purchase permit, he must provide a statement to the applicant citing the specific facts and law on which he based his denial.

Additionally, the bill also creates a new status of being an armed habitual felon. Anyone who has been convicted of one firearm related felony and commits a second will be sentenced as a Class C felony. (The term "firearm related felony" includes any felony committed by a person where that person used or displayed a firearm while committing the felony.)

The pertinent provisions of this bill above are effective October 1, 2013. (Other provisions may have a different effective date.)

Police chiefs from UNC system campuses and others expressed opposition. The N.C. Sheriffs Association backed the portions of the bill that strengthened background checks for those with mental health problems and that increased penalties for gun crimes. The Senate sponsor of the measure, Sen. Buck Newton, (R., Wilson Co.), received support from Grass Roots North Carolina and the N.C. Pistol and Rifle Association.

Passage of this bill has necessitated revisions to the Legal block of instruction for the Firearms Instructor Training course and the instructor and student manual for the armed guard course.

- 5. At the April and June meetings Attorney Gray reported that five bills have been filed in the General Assembly affecting all occupational and professional licensing boards, including the PPSB. The status of the bills is as follows:
 - SB 32, periodic Review and Expiration of Rules Re-referred to Committee on Program Evaluation 5/14/13.
 - SB 33, Use of Criminal History Records by Licensing Boards Signed by Governor 4/9/13.
 - SB 36, APA Technical/Clarifying Changes (This bill is identical to HB 165) SB 36 passed Senate, then House with amendments; failed to pass Senate; Conference Committee appointed 4/24/13; eligible for consideration in "short" session. (No action on HB 165.)

- SB 37, PED Study Occupational Licensing Board Agency (This bill is identical to HB 166.) No action on either bill, however, this study appeared in HB 79, below.
- HB 74, Periodic Review and Expiration of Rules (This bill is identical to SB 34, except the word "substantive" modifies the word "changes" in the amendment to G.S. 150B-21.2(c)(1).) HB 74 passed House; referred to Senate Rules Committee.; eligible for consideration in "short" session. (No action on SB 34.)
- HB 79, Improve and Streamline the Regulatory Process, passed the General Assembly and is awaiting signature or veto by the Governor.

V. PENDING CASES

At the March 2013 Board meeting, the Board was informed by deputies with the Brunswick Co. Sherriff's Office that William Haglar of Oak Island, NC was under criminal investigation for performing private investigation services and holding himself out as private investigator without a license. Mr. Haglar has received five (5) C&D letters from the Board over a six (6) year period for the same activities. On March 25, 2013 Attorney Gray filed a Complaint for Injunctive Relief on behalf of the Board in *NC PPSB v. William John Hagler*, 13 CVS 004090 – Wake Co. Mr. Haglar filed an Answer, pro se, to the Complaint. In early June Attorney Gray learned from the Sheriff's Office that Mr. Haglar had posted LinkedIn and other social network postings on-line holding himself out as a PI after the lawsuit was filed. Attorney Gray filed a motion on June 13th and obtained an Order Granting Preliminary Injunction on June 24, 2013 in Wake County Superior Court to enjoin Mr. Haglar's activities.

The Brunswick County Sheriff's Office arrested and criminally charged Mr. Haglar for violation of the Board's law and rules as well as felony obtaining property by false pretenses. He is free on \$10,000 secured bond awaiting trial.

Detective Ed Carter, who appeared at the Board's April meeting, should be commended for his hard work and diligence in pursuing Mr. Haglar.

The Board discussed the draft amendment to 12 NCAC 07D .0301(b), .0401(b), .0501(b), .0601(b) and .0901(f) requiring military spouses to hold a current license, certification or registration from another jurisdiction in order to be licensed by the Private Protective Services Board. The Rules Review Commission objected to the requirement. After considering the provision, the recommendation was to drop the requirement for a military spouse to hold a current license, certification or registration from another jurisdiction.

MOTION BY MR. BOOTH TO DROP THE REQUIREMENT FOR A MILITARY SPOUSE TO HOLD A CURRENT LICENSE, CERTIFICATION OR REGISTRATION FROM ANOTHER JURISDICTION; SECONDED BY MR. WEAVER; MOTION CARRIED.

The Board also discussed the other two (2) proposed rules changes. The first being that industry members will receive two (2) credit hours instead of one (1) for attending Board meetings and the other being the penalty shall be the same for providing false information to a third party criminal record check vendor as providing false information to the Board. Attorney Gray discussed the wording of the rule change regarding credit hours. It was decided that an industry member will receive no more than four (4) credit hours a year or eight (8) per renewal period for attending Board meetings.

MOTION BY JUDGE BURRIS TO ACCEPT THE RULE CHANGES; SECONDED BY MR. WEAVER; MOTION CARRIED.

Chairman Allen recommended that the Board send a letter of appreciation to the Brunswick County Sheriff's Department regarding their assistance with the case against Mr. William Hagler.

Judge Burris asked for clarification on the status of the consent agreement with Mr. Lewis Glover. Mr. Bonapart advised that to date Mr. Glover has not made a payment and he was sent a letter asking him to appear before the Grievance Committee on October 22, 2013.

Chairman Richard Allen called the October 24, 2013 Private Protective Services Board meeting to order at 9:03 a.m. Chairman Allen welcomed all guests.

GOOD OF THE ORDER:

Attorney Jeff Gray explained the State Ethics Act, which addresses the ethics of public officials. This Act states specifically that if any Board Member has any conflict of interest, potential conflict of interest, or the appearance of a conflict, he or she should remove themselves from deliberation and vote on that matter and so state on the record.

Mr. Gregory Hatten, president of the NCAPI greeted the Board and all of the guests. Mr. Hatten stated that the NCAPI Conference is scheduled for November 13th through the 15th in Clemmons, NC. A golf tournament will kick off the conference on the 13th; classes will begin on the 14th for twelve (12) credit hours.

APPROVAL OF THE AUGUST 22, 2013 MEETING MINUTES.

MOTION BY MR. WEAVER TO ACCEPT THE MINUTES; SECONDED BY MR. GRAHAM; MOTION CARRIED.

SCREENING COMMITTEE REPORT:

Mr. Clark reported that the Screening Committee met on Wednesday, October 23, 2013 from 8:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. to review a total of 37 applications. (See report). The committee members were Mr. Clark, Mr. Benson, Mr. MacRae, Mr. Weaver, Mrs. Martin and Mr. Cobbler. Mrs. Clark read the report for the record. Mr. Stevens recused himself from #5 and #24. Mr. Allen recused himself from #27. Mr. Weaver recused himself from #19.

Mr. Clark presented the following registration report for the period of August 20, 2013 to October 18, 2013. Total registrations 4,210; armed totals were 659 of which 181 were new and 403 were renewals, 3 duplicate, and 72 reissue/dual. There were a total of 20 Armed Armored Car, 6 of which were new, 14 were renewals. There were a total of 12 armed Private Investigators, 5 new Private Investigator and 7 renewals, and 3 new armed Private Investigator Associate, 1 New, 1 Renewal, 1 Reissue/Dual. Unarmed totals were 3,515 which included 1,329 new, 1,854 renewals, 140 transfers, 24 duplicates and 168 reissue/dual. Total denials were 545 of which 144 were for cause and 401 for correctable reasons. There were 505 applications approved which were previously denied for a total of 1,050 denials reviewed.

FINAL AGENCY DECISION

Attorney Jeff Gray removed himself as counsel to the Board to present the following cases.

The Board received the official record for the following cases:

Marcus L. Fuller 13-DOJ-13653 (attachment 7). Mr. Fuller was present. This case was heard by Administrative Law Judge Fred G. Morrison on July 23, 2013. This case involved the issue of whether the Petitioner's firearms trainer certification should be revoked for making a false statement or giving false information in connection with any application for license registration or permit or for renewal or reinstatement of a license, registration or permit, and for submitting inaccurate scores in violation of the Board's armed training requirements.

Administrative Law Judge Fred G. Morrison finds that the revocation of Petitioner's firearms instructor certificate be upheld.

MOTION BY MR. WEAVER TO ACCEPT UPHOLDING SUSPENSION; SECONDED BY MR. BOOTH; MOTION CARRIED.

Danielle J. Rankin 13-DOJ-9038 (attachment 10). Ms. Rankin was present. This case was heard by Senior Administrative Law Judge Augustus B. Elkins II on April 23, 2012. This case involved the denial of Petitioner's application for a new unarmed guard registration permit pursuant to N.C.G.S. 74C-1 et seq. based on Petitioner's lack of good moral character and temperate habits as evidenced by Petitioners criminal record.

Senior Administrative Law Judge Fred G. Morrison, Jr. proposed that the Board reverse its initial decision to deny Petitioner's unarmed guard registration.

MOTION BY MR. CLARK TO ACCEPT OFFICE OF ADMINISTRATIVE HEARINGS DECISION AND GRANT MS. RANKIN A REGISTRATION; SECONDED BY MRS. MARTIN; MOTION CARRIED.

Cameron Clinkscale 13-DOJ05095 (attachment 8).Mr. Clinkscale was not present. This case was heard by Administrative Law Judge Gene Cella on February 26, 2013. This case involved the denial of Petitioner's unarmed guard registration based on Petitioner's lack of good moral character and temperate habits as evidenced by two (2) convictions of misdemeanor Disorderly Conduct in the State of Ohio.

Administrative Law Judge Gene Cella proposed that the Board reverse its denial of Petitioner's application for an unarmed guard registration.

MOTION BY MR. MACRACE TO CONTINUE THE MATTER TO THE NEXT BOARD MEETING; SECONDED BY MR. BENSON; MOTION CARRIED.

JonPaul D Wallace 13-DOJ-02422 (attachment 9). Mr. Wallace was not present. The Petitioner's appeal is dismissed without prejudice for failure to prosecute.

MOTION BY JUDGE BURRIS TO UPHOLD DECISION TO DISMISS; SECONDED BY MR. BOOTH; MOTION CARRIED.

Antonio R. Dickens 13-DOJ-08953 (attachment 11). Mr. Dickens was not present. This case was heard by Administrative Law Judge Augustus B. Elkins II on April 23, 2013. This case involved the denial of Petitioner's application for a new unarmed guard registration permit pursuant to N.C.G.S. 74C-1 as evidenced by Petitioner's criminal record.

Administrative Law Judge Augustus B. Elkins II finds sufficient evidence to uphold the denial of Respondent's unarmed guard registration permit.

MOTION BY MR. BENSON TO ACCEPT THE ORIGINAL DECISION; SECONDED BY MR. BENSON; MOTION CARRIED.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Director Terry Wright read the report for the record. The current PPS budget as of September 30, 2013, has a balance of \$400,116.23; the Education Fund balance is \$64,929.58. As of October 21, 2013, the total registrations for PPS is 18,548, 1,823 licensees, and 591 certifications.

Mr. Wright noted that there have been a total of 2,465 various correspondences printed from the PPS database, 4,950 registration cards have been printed and a total of 5,771 applications received since the last Board meeting.

MOTION BY MR. COBBLER TO ACCEPT THE DIRECTOR'S REPORT; SECONDED BY MR. MACRAE; MOTION CARRIED.

Mr. Wright updated the Board on the status of the new computer system upgrade. Mr. Wright stated that GL Solutions is not abiding by the RFP and that the DOJ IT has sent a formal letter of dispute. GL Solutions has ten (10) days to respond and thirty (30) days to make corrections and as of right now the project is on hold. To date no payments have been made. Mr. Wright advised if anything comes up before the next Board meeting and a teleconference needs to be scheduled he will advise the Chairman of such.

ATTORNEY'S REPORT:

Attorney Gray discussed the following:

I. CONSENT AGREEMENT, SETTLEMENT AGREEMENTS & CIVIL PENALTIES

- 1. Lewis Glover, Jr./Knight Protective Services, Inc. On October 25, 2012, the Private Protective Services Board voted to enter into a consent agreement in the amount of \$1,288.20 for 8 unarmed and 2 armed registration violations. The payment has not been received.
- 2. Mr. Kenneth Wayne Berg/Garda CL, Inc. On June 20, 2013, the Private Protective Services Board voted to enter into a consent agreement with Mr. Berg in the amount of \$6,793.20 for 37 armed registration violations.
- 3. JayJay Miller/Landmark Security, Inc. On June 20, 2013 the Private Protective Services board voted to enter into a consent agreement with Mr. Miller in the amount of \$4096.32

in three monthly installments for 42 unarmed registration violations. Second payment received on 9/24/2013(\$1,365.44)

- 4. Brian Joseph White/Eagle Eye Security. On August 22, 2013, the Private Protective Services Board voted to enter into a consent agreement with Mr. Woodell in the amount of \$6,487.20 for 50 unarmed and 2 armed registrations violations. Paid in full.

- 2. The G.S. 150B-19.1 Certification forms for the following rules changes were submitted to the Rules Review Commission on October 4, 2013 and certified on October 17, 2013:
 - Amendment to 12 NCAC 07D .0106, .0501, .0502, .0503, .0504 and .1302.

IV. PENDING BILLS EFFECTING PPS

At the April, June and August meetings, Attorney Gray reported on five (5) bills filed in the General Assembly affecting all occupational and professional licensing boards, including the PPSB. Two of these bills passed:

- SB 33, Use of Criminal History Records by Licensing Boards- Signed by Governor 4/9/13 (see attachment to June 20, 2013 Attorney's Report).
- HB 74, Improve and Streamline the Regulatory Process, (see attachment 3; only pp. 1-3).

As previously reported, the Board has compiled with the requirements of SB33 for many years. House Bill 74, however, is a different story. It adds numerous additional steps to the rulemaking process in an effort to "improve" it. A chart showing the new permanent rule making process is attached (see attachment 4). Further, and as part of the "streamlining" intended by the legislature, HB74 mandates an extensive under-taking for all of State government and will require the Board to review all of its existing administrative rules. Attorney Gray has already attended a training session where the proposed procedure was explained. At this point Attorney Gray does not know when the process for occupational licensing boards will begin but the proposed procedure anticipates it will be towards the end of an estimated five (5) year process.

V. PENDING CASES

At the March 2013 Board meeting, the Board was informed by deputies with the Brunswick County Sheriff's Office that Bill Haglar of Oak Island, NC was under criminal investigation for performing private investigation services and holding himself out as a private investigator without a license. Mr. Haglar has received five (5) C&D letters from the Board, on

March 25, 2013 Attorney Gray filed a Complaint for Injunctive Relief on behalf of the Board in NC PPSB v. *William John Haglar*, 13 CVS 004090 – Wake Co. Mr. Haglar filed an Answer, *pro se*, to the Complainant.

In early June Attorney Gray learned from the Sheriff's Office that Mr. Haglar had posted LinkedIn and other social network postings online holding him out as a PI after the lawsuit was filed. Attorney Gray filed a motion on June 13th and obtained an Order Granting Preliminary Injunction on June 24, 2013 in Wake County Superior Court to enjoin Haglar's activities.

The Brunswick County Sheriff's Office arrested and criminally charged Mr. Haglar for violation of the board's law and rules as well as felony obtaining property by false pretenses. He is free on \$10,000 secured bond awaiting trial.

On August 20, 2013, Mr. Haglar represented himself to Heather Howle, Assistant Director of the Brunswick County Senior Center, as a private investigator. He also gave Ms. Howle a business card with his name and "Investigative Services" under it and the logo of "Haglar Investigative Services." He admitted to the investigating officer he had done so and that he is unlicensed. I obtained an affidavit from Ms. Howle and Sgt. M.L. Williams of the Southport Police Department, then filed a Motion for Order to Show Cause and a hearing was set for Monday, October 14, 2013. Mr. Haglar appeared, represented by counsel, and the Court allowed the matter to be continued since his attorney had not been retained except for that appearance. The matter has not been re-calendared for hearing.

Also, at the request of the Board, Detective Ed Carter, who appeared at the Board's April meeting, was commended in a letter to his Sheriff from Anthony Bonapart for his hard work and diligence in pursuing Mr. Haglar and his assistance to Attorney Gray.

MOTION BY MR. STEVENS TO ACCEPT ATTORNEY'S REPORT; SECONDED BY MR. WEAVER; MOTION CARRIED.

CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Richard Allen called the December 12, 2013 Private Protective Services Board meeting to order at 9:18 a.m. Chairman Allen welcomed all guests.

GOOD OF THE ORDER:

Attorney Jeff Gray explained the State Ethics Act, which addresses the ethics of public officials. This Act states specifically that if any Board Member has any conflict of interest, potential conflict of interest, or the appearance of a conflict, he or she should remove themselves from deliberation and vote on that matter and so state on the record.

Mr. Gregory Hatten, president of the NCAPI greeted the Board and all of the guests. Mr. Hatten reported that the NCAPI Fall Conference was a success with 148 attendees. He also stated that the Spring Conference is scheduled for March of 2014 and he requested that Staff be present.

MINUTES:

APPROVAL OF THE OCTOBER 21, 2013 MEETING MINUTES.

Attorney Gray stated that the motion to continue for page six (6) of the Final Agency Decisions will be left as is and will be addressed during the Final Agency Decisions.

MOTION BY MR. WEAVER TO ACCEPT THE MINUTES; SECONDED BY MR. MACRAE; MOTION CARRIED.

SCREENING COMMITTEE REPORT:

Mr. Clark reported that the Screening Committee met on Wednesday, December 11, 2013 from 2:03 p.m. until 4:55 p.m. to review a total of 43 applications. (See report). The committee members were Mr. Clark, Mr. Benson, Mr. MacRae, Mr. Weaver, Mrs. Martin and Mr. Cobbler. Mr. Clark read the report for the record.

Mr. Clark also reported that Mr. Clarence Cox appeared before the Screening Committee to have his license reinstated. The committee recommended that his license be reinstated upon his completion of the required twelve (12) continuing education credit hours.

Mr. Clark presented the following registration report for the period of October 22, 2013 to December 9, 2013. Total registrations 3,425; armed totals were 414 of which 137 were new and 232 were renewals, 2 duplicate, and 43 reissue/dual. There were a total of 72 Armed Armored Car, 28 of which were new, 43 were renewals, 1 reissue/dual. There were a total of 7 armed

Private Investigators, 6 new Private Investigator and 1 renewal, and 2 armed Private Investigator Associate, 1 New, 1 Renewal. Unarmed totals were 2,921 which included 1,158 new, 1,329 renewals, 211 transfers, 15 duplicates and 208 reissue/dual. There were a total of 9 unarmed armored car, 5 of which were new. Total denials were 326 of which 70 were for cause and 316 for correctable reasons. There were 459 applications approved which were previously denied for a total of 845 denials reviewed.

Mr. Booth asked what "May Work" means in the Registration report. Mr. Wright explained that an applicant who is denied may be granted an extension to work at the discretion of the Director.

MOTION BY MR. STEVENS TO ACCEPT THE SCREENING COMMITTEE REPORT AND THE REGISTRATION REPORT; SECONDED BY MR. BENSON; MOTION CARRIED.

GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE REPORT:

Chairman Allen reported the Grievance Committee met on Wednesday, December 11, 2013 from 8:06 a.m. until 12:06 p.m. and heard a total of 8 cases. The committee members were Judge Burris, Mr. Booth, Mr. Cook, Mr. Epley, Mr. Graham and Mr. Stevens. Judge Burris presented the attached report. (See attachment).

MOTION BY MR. STEVENS TO ACCEPT THE GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE REPORT; SECONDED BY MR. BOOTH; MOTION CARRIED.

TRAINING & EDUCATION COMMITTEE:

Mr. Stevens advised that the Training & Education Committee met on Thursday, December 12, 2013 from 8:00 a.m. until 9:00 a.m. The committee members were Mr. Stevens, Mr. Allen, Mr. Booth, Mr. Clark, Mr. Epley, Mr. MacRae and Mr. Weaver.

Presently we have 350 certified PPS unarmed guard trainers and 87 PPS certified armed guard trainers.

The following PPS Training Courses for CEU Credits have been scheduled:

December 12, 2013 1 pm – 5 pm Raleigh

The following PPS Training Courses have been completed:

November 18-22, 2013 8 am – 5 pm UGT Course and Workshop WTCC

November 25, 2013 10 am – 11 pm FT Re-Certification & Pre-Qualification course

Mr. Booth reported on the Firearms Trainers subcommittee meeting. The following recommendations were made:

- PPSB will contract with the Justice Academy to hold catch up classes. Tentatively in January and February in the western part of the state.
- PPSB will change the expenditure of the Education Fund. A maximum of \$5,000.00 will be used to offset the balance of scheduled classes so that there will be no need to cancel the class if not enough participants. The minimum number of participants will be lowered to three (3).
- PPSB Staff will contact the Justice Academy to inquire if the current fee can be changed to a non-refundable fee.
- Staff will notify the Board when funds will need to be used in order to offset the balance of a scheduled class.

MOTION BY MR. BOOTH TO ACCEPT THE SUBCOMMITTEES RECOMMENDATIONS; SECOND BY MR. MACRAE; MOTION CARRIED.

Mr. Stevens reported on an inquiry by licensee Peter Rubino in reference to a course he submitted for continuing education credit. Staff sent Mr. Rubin a letter informing him that the OSHA course he submitted was not pertinent to the private investigation field and therefore denied the course. The committee's recommendation is to uphold the decision of staff.

MOTION BY MR. BOOTH TO DENY THE CONTINUING EDUCATION COURSE; SECONDED BY MR. MACRAE; MOTION CARRIED.

Mr. Stevens reported that there was one course the subcommittee reviewed for approval: Legal Aspects and Techniques of Surveillance Investigation, six (6) credit hours.

MOTION BY MR. EPLEY TO ACCEPT THE CONTINUING EDUCATION COURSE; SECONDED BY MR. WEAVER; MOTION CARRIED.

MOTION BY MR. BENSON TO ACCEPT THE TRAINING AND EDUCATION COMMITTEE REPORT; SECONDED BY MR. MACRAE; MOTION CARRIED.

GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE:

Judge Burris discussed a recent issue that was brought before the Grievance Committee. He discusses the possibility of additional sanction options as the structured punishment for violations may be too lenient or too harsh and how to use the twenty (20) day probation. Mr. Stevens stated that the amount of fines could quite possibly put smaller companies out of business and whether there should be flexibility in assessing fines. Judge Burris stated that a lot of the licensees/companies that are brought before the grievance committee use not understanding the statute 74C as an excuse.

Mr. Phillip Stevens stated that the statute is addressed in the licensee's face to face interview with the investigators. Mr. Clark suggested that the statute be divided into parts, for example

private investigator, security guard and patrol, etc. Mr. Booth also suggested that an index be added to the statute to make it easier for the licensee to reference.

Judge Burris suggested that this issue be given to Attorney Gray and staff for further discussion.

MOTION BY MR. MACRAE TO ACCEPT THE COMMITTEE'S REPORT; SECONDED BY MR. BOOTH; MOTION CARRIED.

SCREENING COMMITTEE:

Mr. Gary Pastor wrote a letter to staff and board members asking whether Private Investigator Associates are allowed to distribute business cards with their names before they become licensed. The Board recommended that private investigator associates may hand out general business cards for the company they work for as long as it does not list their name.

Mr. Stephenson stated that asking applicants to submit their own Equifax Credit Reports has become cumbersome and costly for staff. He recommended that staff go back to running their own credit reports so that investigators only receive the information that is needed and money is not wasted on postage and making copies.

MOTION BY MR. CLARK TO ACCEPT THE STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS ON BUSINESS CARDS AND STAFF RUNNING THE APPLICANT CREDIT REPORT; SECONDED BY MR. BENSON; MOTION CARRIED.

This case involved the denial of Petitioner's private investigator license based on the lack of good moral character as evidenced by a conviction of misdemeanor possession of stolen goods, numerous convictions of traffic related offenses, and a lack of financial responsibility.

Administrative Law Judge Fred G. Morrison proposes that while the Board has grounds to deny Petitioner's application, it should consider granting a probationary license with conditions satisfactory to the Board.

Randy L. Sawyer, Sr. 13 DOJ 10980 (attachment 6). Mr. Sawyer was present. This case was heard by Administrative Law Judge Melissa Owens Lassiter on May 28, 2013. This case involved the denial of Petitioner's unarmed guard permit based on lack of good moral character and temperate habits as evidenced by a conviction of felony Assault With A Deadly Weapon Inflicting Serious Injury.

Administrative Law Judge Melissa Owens Lassiter proposed that the Board reverse its' decision and recommends that Petitioner be issued an unarmed guard registration.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Director Terry Wright read the report for the record. The current PPS budget as of October 31, 2013, has a balance of \$549,391.79; the Education Fund balance is \$63,643.48. As of October 21, 2013, the total registrations for PPS is 18,548, 1,823 licensees, and 591 certifications.

Mr. Wright noted that there have been a total of 2,465 various correspondences printed from the PPS database, 4,950 registration cards have been printed and a total of 5,771 applications received since the last Board meeting.

Mr. Wright also reported that staff met with GL Solutions from November 18th through November 21st to address all issues and concerns regarding the computer upgrade. The new projected go live date for the computer system will be announced at the next board meeting. Mr. Wright also announced that the Alarm Board will be hosting the IAFTA in 2015.

III. RULES

- 1. The Notice of Text for the following rule changes were filed on November 5, 2013.
 - Amendment to 12 NCAC 07D .0106, .0501, .0502, .0503, .0504 and .1302

The Public Hearing will be held January 23, 2014 at 2:00 p.m. at the Board's office.

2. Board staff requested that a rule change be made to 12 NCAC 07D .0901(e) to delete the provision allowing firearms instructors certified by the Criminal Justice Education and Training Commission to pay only one-half the course fee amount to attend the required portion of the firearms trainer course. The board approved a proposed rule change at its October 24, 2013 meeting, The G.S. 150B-19.1 certification form for this rule changed has been filed and it will be considered the certification at the next Rules Review Commission meeting.

IV. REVIEW OF RULES

- 1. Section 57 of S.L. 2011-398 (SB781) required each State agency, board, commission or other body with rule making powers to submit a report listing all permanent rules adopted by the agency to include in each rule the following information:
 - Whether the rule is mandated by a federal law or regulation.
 - If the rule is not mandated by a federal law or regulation, whether there is a federal regulation that is analogous to the rule. For purposes of this provision, "analogous" means the federal regulation regulates the same conduct or activity as the State regulation.
 - If there is federal law or regulation analogous to the rule, where the rule is more stringent than the federal law or regulation.

This required report was made to the Joint Select Regulatory Reform Committee in 2011.

S.L. 2011-398 also amended N.C.G.S § 150B to require the Board to conduct annual review of its administrative rules using statutory criteria analyzing the reasonableness and necessity of the rule and the burden on those that must comply with the rule. This task has been assigned to the 74C Re-write Committee and

staff. The requisite review has been conducted for 2013 and no rule has been identified for repeal. A motion so finding is recommended.

2. During the 2012 Session of the Legislature, the Joint Legislative Administrative Oversight Committee replaced the Joint Select Regulatory Reform Committee referenced above. This Committee again has oversight over the study by the Program Evaluation Division of the structure, organization and operation of all occupational licensing boards in the State as required by Section 10(a) of S.L. 2013-413 and reported to the Board at its August and October meetings.

Attorney Gray has been attending the meetings of this Committee as reported at the October 24th Board meeting. At its December 3, 2013 meeting the Director of the Program Evaluation Division reported to the Committee on the status of this study.

V. BOARD POLICY

Following a vote by the Board at its October 24th meeting to delete the requirement in the Board Affidavit Policy requiring an appearance before the Screening Committee prior to submitting an Affidavit in support of work experience. Attorney Gray was asked to re-visit the Policy accordingly. Adoption by the Board of this revised Policy is recommended.

VI. PENDING CASES

At the March 2013 Board meeting, you were informed by deputies with the Brunswick Co. Sheriff's Office that Bill Haglar of Oak Island, NC was under criminal investigation for performing private investigation services and holding himself out as a private investigator without a license. Mr. Haglar has received five (5) C&D letters from the Board over a six (6) year period for the same activities. As a result, and upon motion of the Board, on March 25, 2013 Attorney Gray filed a Complaint for Injunctive Relief on behalf of the Board in *NC PPSB v. William John Haglar*, 13 CVS 004090 – Wake Co. Mr. Haglar filed an Answer, *pro se*, to the Complaint.

In early June, Attorney Gray learned from the Sheriff's Office that Mr. Haglar had posted LinkedIn and other social network postings on-line holding him out as a PI after the lawsuit was filed. Attorney Gray filed a motion on June 13th and obtained an Order Granting Preliminary Injunction on June 24, 2013 in Wake County Superior Court to enjoin Mr. Haglar's activities.

The Brunswick County Sheriff's Office arrested and criminally charged Mr. Haglar for violation of the Board's law and rules as well as felony obtaining property by false pretenses. He is free on a \$10,000 secured bond awaiting trial.

Attorney also informed the Board that Mr. Kelly is suing PPSB & Investigator Sarah Conner and the Charlotte-Mecklenburg County ABC.
