CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Eric Weaver called the February 18, 2016 Private Protective Services Board meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. Chairman Weaver requested that Mr. Benson lead the group in the reciting of the Pledge of Allegiance followed by Mr. Weaver introducing new Board member Larry Proctor.

GOOD OF THE ORDER:

Attorney Jeff Gray explained the State Ethics Act, which addresses the ethics of public officials. This Act states specifically that if any Board Member has any conflict of interest, potential conflict of interest, or the appearance of a conflict, he or she should remove themselves from deliberation and vote on that matter and so state on the record.

Mr. Gary Pastor, President of the NCAPI, greeted the Board and all of the guests. Mr. Pastor stated that the association is currently working on many projects including the NCAPI 2016 fall conference. He also stated that they plan to attend the short session beginning in the late Spring and are looking into possibility having one of their members being registered as a lobbyist to be able to advocate in the legislative session. Mr. Pastor stated that a representative from Virginia and Seattle, Washington were in the audience. We hope to work together as a group to become more professionalism in the industry.

Mr. Pastor asked everyone to check out the NCAPI's new website and make sure your information is up to date. He also reminded everyone that the association would be holding their meeting after the conclusion of the PPS Board meeting.

Mr. Cobbler asked Mr. Pastor about 501(C) (3) status for the association. Mr. Pastor replied that he is currently working on it.

SCREENING COMMITTEE REPORT:

Mr. Benson reported that the Screening Committee met on Wednesday, February 17, 2016, from 1:30 p.m. to 4:50 p.m. to review a total of 38 applications. (See report). The committee members were Mr. Benson, Mr. Cobbler, Mr. MacRae, Mr. Arndt and Mr. Lowman. Mr. Benson read the report for the record. (See attachment)

It was noted Mr. Cesena recused himself from #23 of the screening report. It was noted that Mr. MacRae recused himself from #4 & 5 of the screening report.

Mr. Benson presented the following registration report for the period of December 16, 2015 to February 16, 2016. Total registrations 3694; armed totals were 564 of which 153 were new and 286 were renewals, and 125 reissue/dual. There were a total of 74 Armed Armored Car, 33 of which were new, 40 renewals and 1 reissue/dual. There were a total of 13 Armed Private Investigators, 6 of which were new, 6 renewals and 1 reissue/dual. There were a total of 3 Armed Private Investigator Associates, 2 of which was new and 1 reissue/dual. Unarmed totals were 3,019 which included 1070 new, 1724 renewals, 204 transfers, 20 duplicates and 1 reissue/dual. There were a total of 21 unarmed armored cars, 7 of which were new and 14 renewals. Total denials were 785 of which 210 were for cause and 575 for correctable reasons. There were 550 applications approved which were previously denied for a total of 1335 denials reviewed.

Mr. Turner stated that the committee discussed one weapon discharge by an armed registrant since the last Board meeting which involved Mr. Trey Mitchell with Gate City Security Agency, Inc. Upon entering the bathroom for break, he proceeded to unholster his weapon per previous training. Upon completion of using the facilities he gathered his belongings and prepared to holster his duty weapon and his fingers slipped, which caused him to accidentally pull the trigger and resulted in an accidental discharge of his weapon. There are no issues with this officer and staff advised Gate City not to allow the employee to work armed until this matter went before the Board. The Committee decided to remove the temporary work prohibition on Mr. Mitchell.

Mr. MacRae stated that they also discussed the current status of the unarmed guard training course and asked Mr. Turner to arrange additional meetings with the subcommittee to review the initial draft. There was a discussion concerning the newly approved rifle and the committee has

requested that Chad Thompson, PPS Firearm Instructor at the NC Justice Academy in Salemburg, prepared a manual for PPS. Once the manual is complete, a subcommittee will review and report back to Board.

Mr. MacRae stated the following four (4) continuing education training courses have been submitted for approval: How to prepare outline and write investigation reports for insurance companies, attorneys, civil cases, criminal cases, court testimony and investigator ethics (12 hours); Ethics for Legal Professionals: Theory and Practice (2 hours); Rules of Service: Sabbath Law (2 hours); C.A.R.E Interviewing Certification Course (12 hours).

LAWS AND RULES COMMITTEE

Nada Lawrimore stated that they discussed armed applicants and Mr. MacRae is to develop a plan for drug screening for the industry. Also a discussion was held to respond to a request by DPS's legislative liaison to prioritize the provisions in House Bill 299, which is currently pending in the legislative. The committee did so as follows:

- 1. Authority to conduct investigations regarding unlicensed activity and, with the concurrence of the Secretary of Public Safety, issue cease and desist letter.
- 2. Authority to adopt rules establishing standards for the use of any firearm or other weapon approved by the Board.
- 3. Authority to adopt and publish a code of professional conduct for licensees, registrants or permit holders, the violation of which shall be grounds to suspend or revoke pursuant to G.S. 74C-12.

- 4. Authorize the PPS Board to suspend or revoke a trainee's certification if it determines that the trainee made a false statement in connection with the application for certification or for renewal or reinstatement of certification
- 5. Require a proprietary security organization that employs an armed security guard to apply to the PPS Board for a license and to renew its license every two years.
- 6. Require that a security guard must be registered to carry a firearm in an assembly or establishment where alcoholic beverages are sold and consumed. GS 14-269.3 (a) (4)
- 7. Authority to acquire, maintain, store, dispose of, and replace motor vehicles for the use of staff and investigators.
- 8. Authority to acquire, hold, rent, encumber, alienate, and otherwise deal with real property in the same manner as a private person or corporation, subject only to approval of the Governor and the Council of State, with collateral pledged by the Board for an encumbrance being limited to the assets, income, and revenues of the Board.
- 9. Authorize the PPS Board to assess a late fee against any applicant that fails to pay the required initial license fee and make the required payment to the Private Protective Services Education Fund within 90 days after receiving notice of pending licensure approval. The PPS Board would have discretion to grant an additional 30 days to make these payments for good cause upon petition by the applicant.
- 10. Authorize the PPS Board to assess a late fee of up to \$100 against any licensed business entity that failed to obtain a substitute qualifying agent within the time required and against any license applicant who failed to pay the initial license fee or make the required contribution to the Private Protective Services Education Fund within the time required, and authorize the PPS Board to extend the time for a licensee, trainee or registrant to complete the renewal application requirements by up to 90 days if supported by documentation that the extension is needed because of a physical disability or medical condition. Such information provided to the PPS Board to document the applicant's physical disability or medical record would not be a public record.
- 11. Repeal GC 74C-10 (a) through (d) and add "Trainee" in (e).
- 12. Require that if the business entity maintains a physical presence in the State, the qualifying agent must be a resident of the State. GS 74D-2 (C)1
- 13. Amend 74D-3 (4) by eliminating, "(4) An alarm monitoring company located in another state which demonstrates to the Board's satisfaction that it does not

conduct any business through a personal representative present in this State but which solicits and conducts business solely through interstate communication facilities such as telephone messages, earth satellite relay stations and the United States postal service; and"

14. Authorize the Alarm Systems Licensing Board to acquire, hold, rent, encumber, alienate, and otherwise deal with real property in the same manner as a private person or corporation, with the approval of the Governor and the Council of State. Property pledged as collateral for an encumbrance would be limited to the assets, income and revenues of the Alarm Systems Licensing Board.

Mr. Lowman stated that he is pleased to report that everyone is in compliance. There are three members whose training is due Mr. Epley in September, Mr. Weaver in October and Mr. Lowman's in November.

FINAL AGENCY DECISION

Michael Ross Pitchford - 15 DOJ4293. Mr. Pitchford was present. This case was heard by Administrative Law Judge Hon. J. Randolph Ward, on July 28, 2015. This case involved the denial of the petitioner's unarmed guard registration based on lack of good moral character and demonstration of temperate habits as evidenced by a conviction for felony Obtaining Property by False Pretenses and a conviction for misdemeanor Larceny, as well as multiple convictions of Driving While License Revoked.

MOTION BY MR. BENSON TO UPHOLD THE BOARD'S INITIAL DECISION AND DENY MR. PITCHFORD'S UNARMED GUARD REGISTRATION APPLICATION; SECONDED BY MR. COOK; MOTION CARRIED.

Timothy T. J. Conterras - 15 DOJ5300. Mr. Conterras was present. This case was heard by Administrative Law Judge Phil Berger, Jr., on August 25, 2015. This case involved the denial of the petitioner's unarmed guard registration based on lack of good moral character and temperate habits as demonstrated by petitioner's criminal record.

MOTION BY MR. BENSON TO REVERSE THE BOARD'S INITIAL DECISION AND GRANT MR. CONTERRAS HIS UNARMED GUARD REGISTRATION APPLICATION; SECONDED BY MR. COOK; MOTION CARRIED.

John Paul Melki - 15 DOJ3983. Mr. Melki was present. This case was heard by Administrative Law Judge Phil Berger Jr., on August 25, 2015. This case involved the denial of the petitioner's armed guard registration based on lack of good moral character and demonstration of temperate habits as evidenced by a conviction of Assault on a Female.

MOTION BY MR. COBBLER TO REVERSE THE BOARD'S INITIAL DECISION AND GRANT MR. MELKI HIS ARMED GUARD REGISTRATION APPLICATION; SECONDED BY MR. EPLEY; MOTION CARRIED.

Aundra Lynn France - 15 DOJ05833. Ms. France was present. This case was heard by Administrative Law Judge Randall May, on September 25, 2015. This case involved the denial of the petitioner's unarmed guard registration based on lack of good moral character and demonstration of temperate habits as evidenced by a conviction for misdemeanor Simple Assault.

MOTION BY MR. CESENA TO REVERSE THE BOARD'S INITIAL DECISION AND GRANT MS. FRANCE HER UNARMED GUARD REGISTRATION APPLICATION; SECONDED BY MR. COBBLER; MOTION CARRIED.

Mario Da'Shawn Cotton - 15 DOJ05959. Mr. Cotton was not present. This case was heard by Administrative Law Judge Randall May, on September 25, 2015. This case involved the denial of the petitioner's unarmed guard registration based on lack of good moral character and demonstration of temperate habits as evidenced by a conviction for misdemeanor Assault on a Female.

MOTION BY MR. BENSON TO REVERSE THE BOARD'S INITIAL DECISION AND GRANT MR. COTTON HIS UNARMED GUARD REGISTRATION APPLICATION; SECONDED BY MR. CESENA; MOTION CARRIED.

Attorney Gray asked the Board if he can send an individual a copy of his e-mail to prove that we have been in contact with him since he has filed a complaint last year.

MOTION BY MR. BENSON TO NOT WAIVE THE ATTORNEY CLIENT PREVILEGE; SECONDED BY MR. CESENA; MOTION CARRIED.

The Board recommended to have the individual's attorney to contact Attorney Gray directly.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Mr. Echols introduced Donald Foster as the new Deputy Director and two new investigators George Daniels and Ronnie Broadwell. He also welcomed Larry Proctor as a new Board member.

Director Barry Echols read the report for the record. The current PPS budget as of November 30, 2015, has a balance of \$1,240,328.84; the Education Fund balance is \$75,725.88. As of November 30, 2015, the total registrations for PPS is 19,382: 1,804 licensees and 576 certifications.

Mr. Echols reported that there have been a total of 2,707 various correspondences printed from the PPS database, 4,275 registration cards have been printed and a total of 5,348 applications received since the last Board meeting.

Mr. Echols stated he expected to fill Maia's position soon. The scanning project will be going to the State Purchasing and he will copy both Board chairmen regarding the cost. The project may start in March along with the new computer system. He also stated that he is still looking at property and that we can stay at our current building but the rent may go up.

MOTION BY MR. GREENE TO ACCEPT THE DIRECTOR'S REPORT; SECONDED BY MR. MACRAE; MOTION CARRIED.

ATTORNEY'S REPORT:

Attorney Gray explained to the Board that it is starting back negotiating consent agreements using the same formula.

I. CONSENT AGREEMENT, SETTLEMENT AGREEMENTS & CIVIL PENALTIES

1. Donald Frank Talley and North State Security, Inc. – on December 17, 2015 the Private Protective Services Board voted to enter into consent agreement with Mr. Talley in the amount of \$1,836.00 for registration violations. Payment has not been received.

II. OFFICE OF ADMINISTRATIVE HEARINGS

The schedule of hearings in the Office Administrative Hearings is attached to the Attorney's Report. (See, attachment 1.)

III. RULES

1. Amendments to 14B NCAC 16 .0807, .0809, .0901 and .0904 to approve a rifle as an authorized firearm to be carried by armed security guards upon training and registration were approved by the Rule Review Commission at its January 2016 meeting.

A copy of these rule amendments, as they will be published in the North Carolina Administrative Code, are attached. (See attachment rules 2) These rules cannot be implemented until the actual course is approved by the Board and Secretary of Public Safety.

IV. LEGISLATION

I. House Bill 299, "Amend Private Protective Services Act/Changes," was heard in the House Committee on Judiciary III on May 6, 2015. It was amended to add a provision allowing the Board to own real property (with a similar provision for the Alarm Systems Licensing Board) and received a favorable report. However, the serial referral to the House Finance Committee was stricken and it was referred to the House Committee on Rules, Calendar and Operations of the House. There was no further action on this bill thereafter.

Since it has a fee in it, this bill is still eligible for consideration and Mr. Gray will continue to work with Ryan Combs and Jarrett Burr, Legislative Liaisons for DPS, in the "short session" when the legislature re-convenes on April 25, 2016.

- II. A number of other bills of interest - either directly effecting the Board, or Tangentially effecting it - have been introduced this Session. They are:
 - a. Senate Bill 408, "Firearms on School Grounds/Security Guards," would provide that the prohibition on carrying a weapon on educational property would not apply to an armed security guard registered under Chapter 74C of the General Statues when acting in the discharge of the guard's duties with the permission of the college, university, or superintendent of the local school administrative unit. This bill would also allow any local law enforcement agency to request a list of the armed security guards employed by the college, university, or local school administrative unit. It

was referred to Senate Committee on Rules and Operation of the Senate and saw no further action.

b. Four bills, Senate Bill 469, "Occupational Licensing Board Reporting Requirements," Senate Bill 361, "Occupational Licensing Reform Study," and House Bill 760, "Regulatory Reform Act of 2015," and House Bill 765, (also named) Regulatory Reform Act of 2015, each address some aspect of the Program Evaluation Division's Report on occupational licensing boards that was released December 2014. For the most part, the Board was not affected by this Report, however, its status as an "Article 3A agency" under Chapter 150B, the Administrative Procedures Act, could be challenged. (Note: Article 3A is the section that allows the Board to make the final decision following an administrative hearing before the Office of Administrative Hearings.)

House Bill 765 is the only one of these four bills that saw final action, and it passed and was presented to the Governor for signature on October 1st. Most provision in this bill were directed towards environmental issues, but house Bull 765 did contain two interesting provisions. A licensee of an occupational licensing board can no longer be contracted with or employed by the Board to serve as an investigator or inspector <u>if</u> the person is still actively practicing in the profession or occupation, Second, was a provision directing the Joint Legislative Administrative Procedure Oversight Committee to review the recommendations in the Program Evaluation Divisions report on occupational licensing boards, consult with interested parties, and make recommendations for proposed legislation in the "short session."

c. One bill is of particular interest to the Board in that it would help resolve when someone is an "employee" and when the person is an "independent contractor." Aimed at reducing lost tax revenue due to intentional worker misclassification, House Bill 482, "Employee Fair Classification Act," has a specific provision that would require all occupational licensing boards to: 1) include on every application for licensure, permit, or certification, or application for renewal, a certification that the applicant has read and understands the employee misclassification notice set forth in new G.S. 95-278(a)(7); 2) require all applicants to truthfully certify on the appropriate application that the applicant has read and understands the employee misclassification notice set forth in new G.S. 95-278(a)(7); 3) deny the license, permit or certification application of any applicant who fails to comply with the certification requirement; and 4) revoke such license, permit, or certificate and deny and refuse to grant any renewal or other application therefor until the licensee, permittee, certificate holder or applicant shall have furnished evidence sufficient to establish compliance with new G.S. 95-279(a). The bill also provides a succinct definition of "employee."

House Bill 482 passed the House, passed the Senate with amendments, and on return to the House for concurrence was assigned to the Committee on Rules, Calendar and Operations of the House and no further action. It is eligible for consideration in the "short session."

V. PENDING CASES

For the past 30 months Attorney Gray has been reporting to the Board the status of a civil action filed against Board Investigator Sarah Conner, the Board, the City of Charlotte, the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department and various officers of the Charlotte-Mecklenburg PD in *Kelly v. Conner, et al.*, No. 3:13-cv-636 - WDNC. (Mr. Kelly was unlicensed as a security guard business and unregistered as a security guard, but performing armed security guard and patrol services. He was arrested by the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department and charged with violating Chapter 74C.) Attorney Gray informed that the Court granted the Board's Motion to Dismiss Pursuant to Fed.R.Civ.P. 12(b) (6) and Motion for Summary Judgment, as well as similar motions filed by the other Defendants, on May 27, 2015. This action was dismissed with prejudice. The Plaintiff gave notice of appeal on June 24th.

The Plaintiff-Appellant has filed his Brief and Mr. Gray filed the Board's Brief with the Fourth Circuit Court of Appeals on November 13, 2015.

There has been no other action on this case since that time.

Mr. MacRae stated that the committee discussed two weapon discharges by employees since the last Board meeting which the first incident involved Supervisor Jamal A. Richardson, an armed guard with Walton Investigations, Inc., and Derek Bowman an unarmed guard with Randolph Security. Both officers were working at the same event when multiple gunshots were fired by the attendees. The armed guard gave his service weapon to the unarmed guard in which he fired two rounds in the air as warning shots. Supervisor Richardson has been demoted to unarmed guard and Officer Bowman was terminated. The committee recommended that the staff to flag both officer's files should they try to apply for an armed guard registration. The second incident involved Derrick Thornton an armed guard with Security Contracting, Inc. He was off duty and sitting in his personal vehicle at the Department of Public Safety building. While he was waiting in his vehicle he attempted to clear his duty weapon and the handgun discharged and a bullet struck his left hand.

MOTION BY MR. JOHNSON TO FLAG THE FILES OF MR. RICHARDSON AND MR. BOWMAN TO HAVE THEM APPEAR BEFORE THE SCREENING COMMITTEE SHOULD THEY APPLY FOR OR RENEW ARMED REGIGRATION. ALSO TO AMEND THE MOTION TO ALLOW THEM TO WORK UNARMED ONLY; SECONDED BY MR. CESENA; MOTION CARRIED.

The following updates were reported by Mr. MacRae, He stated that the unarmed guard training manual is progressing well and there was one correction made in section A-4. The committee had asked Mr. Turner to check with other community colleges in western region of North Carolina that would be interested in holding the PPS Unarmed Guard Trainer course at their school. Caldwell Community College in Hudson, NC expressed their interest in possibly running the course on their campus. Mr. Turner will bring an update to the T & E Committee once the school's representative has received and reviewed the general requirements for holding UAGT course at their school.

Mr. MacRae stated they discussed the Firearms Training update, the course held in April 2016, and that the shotgun section of the current course being removed. The new Firearms Trainer course has been reduced from a 40 hours course to 32 hours, which consists of the handgun only. Chad Thompson, PPS Firearms Instructor at the NCJA in Salemburg, NC, is currently working on the shoutgun/rifle course lesson plan. Also Mr. Turner the training officer is in process of revising all related forms in reference to the recent change of the lesson plan.

Mr. Turner requested guidance from the committee regarding a firearm instructor who was trying to requalify but failed prior to his certification being expiring.

Tommy Lee Hudson - 15 DOJ08234. Mr. Hudson was not present. This case was heard by Administrative Law Donald W. Overby, on December 29, 2015. This case involved summary suspension of the petitioner's armed registration based the Petitioner's arrest for an assault with a Deadly Weapon Infliction Serious Injury which poses a serious threat to the public's health, safety and welfare.

Gary Dean Brooks - 15 DOJ09336. Mr. Brooks was not present. This case was heard by Administrative Law Donald W. Overby, on December 29, 2015. This case involved the denial of the petitioner's unarmed guard registration based on a conviction of felony Conspiracy to Defraud the United States.

MOTION BY MR. FLETCHER TO UPHOLD THE BOARD'S INITIAL DECISION AND DENY MR. BROOKS UNARMED GUARD REGISTRATION APPLICATION; SECONDED BY MR. COOK; MOTION CARRIED.

Rodale Lamont Allen - 15 DOJ00172. Mr. Allen was not present. This case was heard by Administrative Law Judge Donald W. Overby, on December 29, 2015. This case involved the denial of the petitioner's unarmed guard registration renewal application based on his criminal conviction.

Mr. Arndt recused himself from voting in this matter.

MOTION BY MR. GREENE TO ADOPT THE ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE'S DECISION; SECONDED BY MS. LAWRIMORE; MOTION CARRIED.

Stacy Elmer Guthrie - 15 DOJ09270. Mr. Guthrie was not present. This case was heard by Administrative Law Donald W. Overby, on January 29, 2016 This case involved the denial of the petitioner's Private Investigator License based on lack of good moral character and demonstration of intemperate habits as evidenced by an unfavorable employment history.

MOTION BY MR. GREENE TO UPHOLD THE BOARD'S INITIAL DECISION AND DENY THE APPLICATION FOR MR. GUTHRIE'S PRIVATE INVESTIGATOR LICENSE; SECONDED BY MR. PROCTOR; MOTION CARRIED.

Mr. Arndt, Mr. Lowman, Mr. Cobbler, Mr. Cesena and Mr. MacRae recused themselves from voting in this matter.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Mr. Foster, Deputy Director, gave the Director's Report. He reported that the general assembly drafted a bill in a surprise move to reduce the number of boards. If passed it, will eliminate the Alarm Systems License Board and the entire regulatory system. It will only allow the

Department of Public Safety in its discretion to register the installers (not licensees) and reduce the Private Protective Service to one license with an endorsement. Mr. Foster also stated that he attended a meeting regarding the above and this matter has been tabled until the long session.

Mr. Foster updated the Board on the new computer/scanning project that the contract has been signed and currently waiting on the final release from State IT group.

He informed the Board that they will be filling two open positions, one in the Licensing Unit that will assist Ms. Graham and Ms. Williams (ASLB) and the other position will be in the Registration Unit. Mr. Foster also stated that he apologies for the difficulty everyone has been having with the DPS e-mail account.

Mr. Foster also informed the Board regarding the existing contract with ASLB/PPSB out - ofstate Criminal Record Checks for background checks which allows the Board two one year extension if it so chooses.

MOTION BY MR. CESENA TO EXERCISE THE FIRST OF THE ONE YEAR EXTENSIONS OF CRC CONTRACT; SECONDED BY MR. JOHNSON; MOTION CARRIED.

Mr. Foster read the report for the record. The current PPS budget as of April 30, 2016, has a balance of \$1,293,230.98; the Education Fund balance is \$77,566.96. As of March 31, 2016, the total registrations for PPS is 19,003: 1,736 licensees and 555 certifications.

Mr. Foster reported that there have been a total of 2,788 various correspondences printed from the PPS database, 4,685 registration cards have been printed and a total of 5,858 applications received since the last Board meeting.

MOTION BY MR. COBBLER TO ACCEPT THE DIRECTOR'S REPORT; SECONDED BY MR. FLETCHER; MOTION CARRIED.

ATTORNEY'S REPORT:

Attorney Gray informed the Board that staff has resumed issuing consent agreements using the same formula.

I. CONSENT AGREEMENT, SETTLEMENT AGREEMENTS & CIVIL PENALTIES

- 1. Mr. David Grimes and Sentry Security Services, Inc. - On October 22, 2015 the Private Protective Services Board voted to enter into a consent agreement with Mr. Grimes in the amount of \$1762.56 registration violations. Paid in full on February 25, 2016
- 2. Mr. Mark Eric Zudell and ABM Security, Inc. On October 22, 2015 the Private Protective Services Board voted to enter into a consent agreement with Mr. Zudell in the amount of \$12,974.40 for registration violations. Payment has not been received.
- 3. Mr. Donald Talley and North State Security - On December 17, 2015 the Private Protective Services Board voted to enter into a consent agreement with Mr. Talley in the amount of \$1,836.00 for registration violations. Paid in full on March 23, 2016
- 4. Mr. Paul Manley and Show Pros Entertainment Services of Charlotte, Inc.- On March 17, 2016 the Private Protective Services Board voted to enter into a consent agreement with Mr. Manley in the amount of \$53,611.20, to be paid in three (3) monthly installments, for registration violations. Received first payment on April 14, 2016 in the amount of \$17,870.40.
- 5. Mr. Daitwan Hardy and Security Contracting, Inc. On February 17, 2016 the Private Protective Services Board voted to enter into a consent agreement with Mr. Hardy in the amount of \$5,385.60 for registration violations. Payment has not been received.

II. OFFICE OF ADMINISTRATIVE HEARINGS

The schedule of hearings in the Office Administrative Hearings is attached to the Attorney's Report. (See, attachment 1.)

III. RULES

The Board currently has no pending rule adoptions or amendments.

IV. LEGISLATION

1. In a surprise move, a proposed bill was circulated at the Joint Legislative Administrative Procedures Oversight ("Joint APO") Committee subcommittee on Occupational Licensing Boards at its meeting on Thursday, March 17th. This bill is an off-shoot of the Legislative Program Evaluation Division's Report on Occupational

Licensing Agencies which Mr. Gray has reported on to the Board and a bill from last session instructing Joint APO to further study the issue (see below)

One section of this bill would - - if passed - - eliminate the Alarm Systems Licensing Board and the entire regulatory system for the industry. In turn, the Department of Public Safety would, in its discretion, be authorized to register installers (but only installers; no business license.)

Numerous other boards and professions or occupations - - from podiatrists to electrologists - - were targeted for elimination (as with the ASLB) or for consolidation with another board.

Another section of the bill applied to <u>all</u> occupational and professional licensing boards and would allow a board to issue only one license; the board could however have "endorsements" for each license. (For instance, for PPSB the Board would issue a "Private Protective Services License" with an endorsement for "Polygraph Examiner.")

Please note, this was only a "draft" and it has not been introduced. It quickly got a lot of questions from the legislators that sit on the Subcommittee and push back from the licensees of these boards, board members and staff, and members of the public. These opponents quickly mobilized and appeared in mass at the full Joint Legislative Administrative Procedures Oversight Committee meeting on April 14th. After hearing from some two dozen speakers, and turning away two to three times that many more, a motion was made to table consideration of the bill - - and the entire issue - - until the "long session" of the General Assembly, which will convene in January 2017.

2. House Bill 299, "Amend Private Protective Services Act/Changes," was heard in the House Committee on Judiciary III on May 6, 2015. It was amended to add a provision allowing the Board to own real property (with a similar provision for the Alarm Systems Licensing Board) and received a favorable report. However, the serial referral to the House Finance Committee was stricken and it was referred to the House Committee on Rules, Calendar and Operations of the House. There was no further action on this bill thereafter.

Since it has a fee in it, this bill is still eligible for consideration and Mr. Gray will continue to work with Ryan Combs and Jarrett Burr, Legislative Liaisons for DPS, in the "short session" when the legislature re-convenes on April 25, 2016.

- 3. A number of other bills of interest - either directly effecting the Board, or tangentially effecting it - have been introduced this Session. They are:
 - a. Senate Bill 408, "Firearms on School Grounds/Security Guards," would provide that the prohibition on carrying a weapon on educational property would not apply to an armed security guard registered under Chapter 74C of the General Statues when acting in the discharge of the guard's duties with the permission of the college, university, or superintendent of the local school administrative unit. This bill would also allow any local law enforcement agency to request a list of the armed security guards employed by the college, university, or local school administrative unit. It was referred to Senate Committee on Rules and Operation of the Senate and saw no further action.
 - b. Four bills, Senate Bill 469, "Occupational Licensing Board Reporting Requirements," Senate Bill 361, "Occupational Licensing Reform Study," and House Bill 760, "Regulatory Reform Act of 2015," and House Bill 765, (also named) Regulatory Reform Act of 2015, each address some aspect of the Program Evaluation Division's Report on occupational licensing boards that was released December 2014. For the most part, the Board was not affected by this Report, however, its status as an "Article 3A agency" under Chapter 150B, the Administrative Procedures Act, could be challenged. (Note: Article 3A is the section that allows the Board to make the final decision following an administrative hearing before the Office of Administrative Hearings.)

House Bill 765 is the only one of these four bills that saw final action, and it passed and was presented to the Governor for signature on October 1, 2015. Most provisions in this bill were directed towards environmental issues, but House Bill 765 did contain two interesting provisions. A licensee of an occupational licensing board can no longer be contracted with or employed by the Board to serve as an investigator or inspector <u>if</u> the person is still actively practicing in the profession or occupation, Second, was a provision directing the Joint Legislative Administrative Procedure Oversight Committee ("Joint APO") to review the recommendations in the Program Evaluation Divisions report on occupational licensing boards, consult with interested parties, and make recommendations for proposed legislation in the "short session."

c. One bill is of particular interest to the Board in that it would help resolve when someone is an "employee" and when the person is an "independent contractor." Aimed at reducing lost tax revenue due to intentional worker misclassification, House Bill 482, "Employee Fair Classification Act," has a specific provision that would require all occupational licensing boards to: 1) include on every application for licensure, permit, or certification, or application for renewal, a certification that the applicant has read and understands the employee misclassification notice set forth in new G.S. 95-278(a)(7); 2) require all applicants to truthfully certify on the appropriate application that the applicant has read and understands the employee misclassification notice set forth in new G.S. 95-278(a)(7); 3) deny the license, permit or certification application of any applicant who fails to comply with the certification requirement; and 4) revoke such license, permit, or certificate and deny and refuse to grant any renewal or other application therefor until the licensee, permittee, certificate holder or applicant shall have furnished evidence sufficient to establish compliance with new G.S. 95-279(a). The bill also provides a succinct definition of "employee."

House Bill 482 passed the House, passed the Senate with amendments, and on return to the House for concurrence was assigned to the Committee on Rules, Calendar and Operations of the House and no further action. It is eligible for consideration in the "short session."

V. PENDING CASES

For the past 30 months Attorney Gray has been reporting to the Board the status of a civil action filed against Board Investigator Sarah Conner, the Board, the City of Charlotte, the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department and various officers of the Charlotte-Mecklenburg PD in *Kelly v. Conner, et al.*, No. 3:13-cv-636 - - WDNC. (Mr. Kelly was unlicensed as a security guard business and unregistered as a security guard, but performing armed security guard and patrol services. He was arrested by the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department and charged with violating Chapter 74C.) The Court granted the Board's Motion to Dismiss Pursuant to Fed.R.Civ.P. 12(b) (6) and Motion for Summary Judgment, as well as similar motions filed by the other Defendants, on May 27, 2015. This action was dismissed with prejudice. The Plaintiff gave notice of appeal on June 24th.

The Plaintiff-Appellant has filed his Brief and Mr. Gray filed the Board's Brief with the Fourth Circuit Court of Appeals on November 13, 2015.

To date, Mr. Gray has not heard back from the court.

I. CONSENT AGREEMENT, SETTLEMENT AGREEMENTS & CIVIL PENALTIES

1. Mr. Mark Eric Zudell and ABM Security, Inc. - - On October 22, 2015 the Private Protective Services Board voted to enter into a consent agreement with Mr. Zudell in the amount of \$12,974.40 for registration violations. Payment has not been received.

MOTION BY MR. GREENE TO REFER MARK ZUDELL AND ABM SECURITY, INC. BACK TO GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE FOR FAILURE TO PAY CONSENT AGREEMENT; SECONDED BY MR. COOK; MOTION CARRIED.

- 2. Mr. Paul Manley and Show Pros Entertainment Services of Charlotte, Inc.- On March 17, 2016 the Private Protective Services Board voted to enter into a consent agreement with Mr. Manley in the amount of \$53,611.20, to be paid in three (3) monthly installments, for registration violations. Paid in full
- 3. Mr. Daitwan Hardy and Security Contracting, Inc. - On February 17, 2016 the Private Protective Services Board voted to enter into a consent agreement with Mr. Hardy in the amount of \$5,385.60 for registration violations. Paid in full

- 4. Mr. Jerry Callicutt and Randolph Security Services On April 21, 2016 the Private Protective Services Board voted to enter into a consent agreement with Mr. Callicutt in the amount of \$5,508.00 registration violations. Paid in full
- 5. Mr. John Callicutt and Walton Investigations, Inc. On April 21, 2016 the Private Protective Services Board voted to enter into a consent agreement with Mr. Callicutt in the amount of \$7,882.56, payable in three (3) monthly installments, for registration violations. Received payment on June 17,2016 in the amount of \$5,255.04.
- 6. Mr. Christopher Hammye Jr. and Job1 USA, Inc. On April 21, 2016 the Private Protective Services Board voted to enter into a consent agreement with Mr. Hammye in the amount of \$3,794.40 registration violations. Payment has not been received.

II. OFFICE OF ADMINISTRATIVE HEARINGS

The schedule of hearings in the Office Administrative Hearings is attached to the Attorney's Report. (*See*, attachment 1.)

III. RULES

The Board currently has no pending rule adoptions or amendments.

IV. LEGISLATION

1. House Bill 299, "Amend Private Protective Services Act/Changes," was passed by the House Committee on Judiciary III on June 14, 2016. It has been assigned to the Senate Committee on Judiciary II. The bill had the Board's requested additions made by way of a Committee Substitute in the House Finance Committee meeting on June 2nd, then was amended on the House floor to remove two provisions related to the Alarm Systems Licensing Board which had been added by the Committee Substitute.

Thanks go to Members Nada Lawrimore and Larry Proctor for diligent efforts in getting movement on this bill. A copy of the bill, as amended and passed, is attached (see attachment 2).

- 2. A number of other bills of interest - either directly effecting the Board, or tangentially effecting it - have been introduced this Session. They are:
 - a. Senate Bill 408, "Firearms on School Grounds/Security Guards," introduced last year, would provide that the prohibition on carrying a weapon on educational property would not apply to an armed security guard registered under Chapter 74C of the General Statues when acting in the discharge of the guard's duties with the permission of the college, university, or superintendent of the local school administrative unit. This bill would also allow any local law enforcement agency to request a list of the armed security guards employed by the college, university, or local school administrative unit. It was referred to Senate Committee on Rules and Operation of the Senate and saw no further action.
 - b. Four bills were introduced last year addressing some aspect of the program Evaluation Division's (PED) Report on occupational licensing boards that was released December 2014: Senate Bill 469, "Occupational Licensing Board Reporting Requirements," Senate Bill 361, "Occupational Licensing Reform Study," and House Bill 760, "Regulatory Reform Act of 2015," and House Bill 765, (also named) Regulatory Reform Act of 2015." For the most part, the Board was not affected by the PED Report, however, its status as an "Article 3A agency" under Chapter 150B, the Administrative Procedures Act, could be challenged. (Note: Article 3A is the section that allows the Board to make the final decision following an administrative hearing before the Office of Administrative Hearings.) This has been addressed in House Bill 1007 which Mr. Gray reported on below.

House Bill 765 is the only one of these four bills that saw final action, and it passed and was presented to the Governor. Most provisions in this bill were directed towards environmental issues, but House Bill 765 did contain two interesting provisions. A licensee of an occupational licensing board can no longer be contracted with or employed by the Board to serve as an investigator or inspector <u>if</u> the person is still actively practicing in the profession or occupation. Second, was a provision directing the Joint Legislative Administrative Procedure Oversight Committee ("Joint APO") to review the recommendations in the PED Report, consult with interested parties, and make recommendations for proposed legislation in the "short session." (Note: A subcommittee of the Joint APO was appointed and its fourth and last meeting to discuss these issues was March 17th. The results are described in paragraph 1 of the Legislation section of the April 21, 2016 Attorney's Report.)

A Second of these four bills, House Bill760, has seen action this year recently passed the House. It mostly is directed towards environmental issues, but does modify the provision of House Bill 765 regarding using licensees as investigators.

- 3. Three bills have been introduced this Session that directly effect the Board:
 - a. House Bill 949 (Senate Bill 744) would require all occupational licensing boards to provide contact information to the Joint APO and keep it current. It was passed by the House June9, 2016 and assigned to the Senate Committee on Rules and Operations of the Senate.
 - b. House Bill 948 (Senate Bill 743) would authorize Joint APO to (further) study oversight of occupational licensing boards and the State Bar and disciplinary actions of occupational licensing boards, and make a report of the study, including any legislative proposals, to 2017 General Assembly.
 - House Bill 1007 would make numerous amendments to Chapter 93B of the c. General Statutes to mainly respond to the U.S. Supreme Court's holding in North Carolinas State Board of Dental Examiners v. Federal Trade Commission. This is a major move by the legislature in that it definitively establishes which boards are "Occupational licensing boards" (OLB) in North Carolina. If enacted, a board is not an OLB unless specifically listed in new G.S. 93B-1(b). Both the Private Protective Services Board and the Alarm System Licensing Board are both on the list. It also adds some additional State agencies which are to receive copies of the reports required by the G.S. 93B-2(a), adds four (4) more reports, and requires the reports to be posted on the board's website; it establishes the boards per diem at \$200.00 per day; it requires all boards to adopt rules delineating its process for complaints, disciplinary actions against licensees and enforcement actions against non-licensees, and requires any interpretation or clarification of scope of practice to be adopted as rule; it (re)establishes the venue for petitions for judicial review ("appeals") and allows for a change of venue; it allows for all boards to be able to seek injunctive relief for violations of its law; it creates a resolution procedure for jurisdictional disputes between boards; and, it mandates development of a complaint process by all boards.

Of particular note for the Board, this bill mandates "disclaimer" language -- which has been pre-approved by the Federal Trade Commission - - for all notifications to unlicensed persons and entities of a possible violation of the law. This was in direct response to the Dental Board case and if enacted will require re-writing of the Board standard form "Cease and Desist" letter.

Also, this bill will clarify the concern Mr. Gray have previously expressed that the PED Report on Occupational Licensing Boards released in December, 2014 could raise an argument that the Board is not an OLB for purposes of hearings under Chapter 150B, Article 3A of the General Statutes. A copy of this bill is attached (attachment 3.)

One bill introduced last year is of particular interest to the Board in that it would help resolve when someone is an "employee" and when the person is an "independent contractor." Aimed at reducing lost tax revenue due to intentional worker misclassification, House Bill 482, "Employee Fair Classification Act," has a specific provision that would require all occupational licensing boards to: 1) include on every application for licensure, permit, or certification, or application for renewal, a certification that the applicant has read and understands the employee misclassification notice set forth in new G.S. 95-278(a)(7); 2) require all applicants to truthfully certify on the appropriate application that the applicant has read and understands the employee misclassification notice set forth in new G.S. 95-278(a)(7); 3) deny the license, permit or certification application of any applicant who fails to comply with the certification requirement; and 4) revoke such license, permit, or certificate and deny and refuse to grant any renewal or other application therefor until the licensee, permittee, certificate holder or applicant shall have furnished evidence sufficient to establish compliance with new G.S. 95-279(a). The bill also provides a succinct definition of "employee."

House Bill 482 passed the House, passed the Senate with amendments, and on return to the House for concurrence was assigned to the Committee on Rules, Calendar and Operations of the House and no further action.

V. PENDING CASES

For the past 34 months Attorney Gray has been reporting to the Board the status of a civil action filed against Board Investigator Sarah Conner, the Board, the City of Charlotte, the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department and various officers of the Charlotte-Mecklenburg PD in *Kelly v. Conner, et al.*, No. 3:13-cv-636 - WDNC. (Mr. Kelly was unlicensed as a security guard business and unregistered as a security guard, but performing armed security guard and patrol services. He was arrested by the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department and charged with violating Chapter 74C.) The Court granted the Board's Motion to Dismiss Pursuant to Fed.R.Civ.P. 12(b) (6) and Motion for Summary Judgment, as well as similar motions filed by the other Defendants, on May 27, 2015. This action was dismissed with prejudice. The Plaintiff gave notice of appeal on June 24[,] 2015

The Plaintiff-Appellant has filed his Brief and Mr. Gray, along with the attorney's representing the Defendants, filed the Board's Brief with the Fourth Circuit Court of Appeals on November 13, 2015.

The attorneys recently received notification that the oral arguments in this matter would be held the week of September 20, 2016. Due to a conflict of one of the attorneys, we are waiting scheduling for Courts' October 2016 term.

Attorney Gray informed the Board that his contract was up for renewal and he is requesting a 10% raised.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Mr. Echols read the report for the record. The current PPS budget as of August 15, 2016, has a balance of \$1,442,651.94; the Education Fund balance is \$79,276.23. As of August 22, 2016, the total registrations for PPS is 19,373: 1,739 licensees and 574 certifications.

Mr. Echols reported that there has been a total of 4,012 registration cards have been printed and a total of 5,775 applications received since the last Board meeting.

Mr. Echols, gave an update on the new computer/scanning project and the continued search for new office space. Mr. Echols advised the Board members that he is currently working with State Property Office relocation group on selecting a new office space and asked the Board to let him know if any of them would like to look at the building once it has been identified.

For the past 34 months Attorney Gray has been reporting to the Board the status of a civil action filed against Board Investigator Sarah Conner, the Board, the City of Charlotte, the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department and various officers of the Charlotte-Mecklenburg PD in *Kelly v. Conner, et al.*, No. 3:13-cv-636 - WDNC. (Mr. Kelly was unlicensed as a security guard business and unregistered as a security guard, but performing armed security guard and patrol services. He was arrested by the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department and charged with violating Chapter 74C.) The Court granted the Board's Motion to Dismiss Pursuant to Fed.R.Civ.P. 12(b) (6) and Motion for Summary Judgment, as well as similar motions filed by the other Defendants, on May 27, 2015 and this action was dismissed with prejudice. The Plaintiff gave notice of appeal on June 24⁻

2015, and the parties filed their respective Brief with the Fourth Circuit of Appeals on November 13, 2015.

The Plaintiff-Appellant has filed his Brief and Mr. Gray, along with the attorney's representing the Defendants, filed the Board's Brief with the Fourth Circuit Court of Appeals on November 13, 2015.

The attorneys recently received notification that the oral arguments in this matter would be held on Tuesday, October 25, 2016 in Richmond, Virginia and Robert M. McDonnell, the attorney for the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department and Mr. Gray will be sharing the Appellees allotted time. Mr. Gray asked the Board if he could have a representative from the Board or staff to accompany him at this court appearance and Mr. Greene volunteered to attend.

Mr. Gray reminded the Board that the renewal of his employment contract was tabled by the Board at its June meeting.

There was a total of 5 Armed Private Investigators, 1 of which were new, 3 renewals and 1 reissue/dual. There was a total of 1 Armed Private Investigator Associates, 1 of which was renewal. Unarmed totals were 3333 which included 1250 new, 1873 renewals, 206 transfers, 4 duplicates. There was a total of 19 unarmed armored cars, 13 of which were new, 6 renewals. Mr. Turner reported on two recent incidents involving security guards. In the first, the owner of Big Dawgs Sweepstakes in Concord, NC Ms. Patricia Newton, hired Sotharoth Sou to work for her business as an armed guard without obtaining a proprietary license or registering Mr. Sou. Mr. Sou shot and killed a suspect during an attempted robbery of the sweepstakes business. Mr. Sou and Ms. Newton were both issued a Cease & Desist letter for alleged violations of 74C.

The second incident was a security guard who work for Guard-One Protective Services was fatally wounded while working an armed post at a Food Lion Store in Greensboro, NC. The suspect approached him from behind and shot the guard at close range and stole his service

weapon. Mr. Smith later died from his wound at the local hospital. There was no confrontation between the officer and the unknown assailant.

Mr. Cesena asked if he and other Board members can receive notification when something like this happen and PPS is aware of it. He would have like to attend the funeral on behalf of the Board members. Also he asked if an armed or unarmed guard is injured while working can PPS either visit the individual or send them a card to let them know that the Board is concerned about the industries.

Mr. MacRae reported that there was a number of items discussed in the meeting that will need action. The first item was the grant program. The Board offers grants to entities to provide educational seminars and training. They will be reimburse as long as they make it available to the entire industry. In the past the issuance of a grant has been restricted to 501(3)(c) non-profit organizations. It became evident at the last meeting that it was not a requirement by statue or administrative rule [refer to NC 74C-30(d) (2)]. The Education and Training Committee approved a new application form that Deputy Director Donald Foster created for the grant which will allow other entity other than the 501(c) to apply for the grant.

After long discussing Mr. Johnson recommended tabling this matter until the next Board meeting.

MOTION BY MR. JOHNSON TO TABLE THE ISSUE OF THE GRANT PROGRAM UNTIL THE NEXT BOARD MEETING TO ALLOW MR. GRAY TO LOOK INTO THE LEGAL DISBURSTMENT OF GRANT FUNDS; SECONDED BY MR. GREENE; MOTION CARRIED.

Mr. MacRae reported that Mr. Turner conducted four training audits and no violations were found.

Mr. Cesena asked Mr. Turner if those were firearm training or qualification sessions and was he able to view the instructor scoring the targets.

Mr. Turner stated that he was able to view one of the sessions while the instructor was scoring targets and in the future plans to attend more actual qualification sessions where he will be able to view both the class room and the scoring of targets.

Mr. Cesena reminded Mr. Turner that at the last Board meeting it was suggested that he notify the Board members of any audit being conducted to allow members who have an interest to be given the opportunity to sit in on some the audit.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Mr. Echols read the report for the record. The current PPS budget as of October 14, 2016, has a balance of \$1,448,870.04; the Education Fund balance is \$76,862.52. As of October 14, 2016, the total registrations for PPS is 20,013: 1,689 licensees and 579 certifications.

Mr. Echols reported that there has been a total of 7,048 registration cards have been printed and a total of 4,124 applications received since the last Board meeting.

Mr. Echols, gave an update on the Permitium/scanning project and the new office space. He stated that the on-line project dates have been set for October 25th, November 8, and 29th at 9:30 am. Mr. Echols stated that on November 2, Paul Blake will be at the office to address billing and stated that if any Board members who will like to attend are welcome. Mr. Echols also informed the Board members that he will be sending out an e-mail to remind them of the same.

b. The Board has expressed an intent to seek introduction of a bill similar to House Bill 299 from the 2015-2016 Session. A draft of such a bill was considered in the October 18th Law and Rules Committee meeting.

V. PENDING CASES

For the past 36 months Attorney Gray has been reporting to the Board the status of a civil action filed against Board Investigator Sarah Conner, the Board, the City of Charlotte, the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department and various officers of the Charlotte-Mecklenburg PD in *Kelly v. Conner, et al.*, No. 3:13-cv-636 - WDNC. (Mr. Kelly was unlicensed as a security guard business and unregistered as a security guard, but performing armed security guard and patrol services. He was arrested by the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department and charged with violating Chapter 74C.) The Court granted the Board's Motion to Dismiss Pursuant to Fed.R.Civ.P. 12(b) (6) and Motion for Summary Judgment, as well as similar motions filed by the other Defendants, on May 27, 2015 and this action was dismissed with prejudice. The Plaintiff gave notice of appeal on June 24⁻ 2015, and the parties filed their respective Brief with the Fourth Circuit of Appeals on November 13, 2015.

Oral arguments in this matter would be held on Tuesday, October 25, 2016 in Richmond, Virginia and Robert M. McDonnell, the attorney for the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department and Mr. Gray will be sharing the Appellees allotted time. At the Board's August meeting, member Justin Greene volunteered to attend the arguments as the Board's representative and was so appointed by the chair.

The Unarmed Guard Training powerpoint presentation and trainer manual are still in the process of being updated and there will be a subcommittee appointed that will be tasked with updating the entire Unarmed Guard Trainer manual.

Mr. Turner reported that in reference to the new Long-gun(shotgun) course, the first course was instructed by Steve Johnson at Camp Butner, NC from November 28-30, 2016. Ten students participated in this course and other current PPS Firearms Instructors have also expressed interest in attending. The cost to attend this 24-hours course is \$175.00.

Mr. Turner reported he conducted one training audit and no violations were found.

Mr. Turner also stated that he will notify Board members from the T & E Committee (Bud Cesena, Steve Johnson and David Arndt) of future armed guard training dates submitted by current PPS Firearms Trainers to allow them to assist in conducting those audits in the future.

Mr. MacRae stated that the request submitted by Chris Newton with Duke Energy regarding the exemption from the PPS standard training is still under consideration and will require a

legislative change. He also stated that the committee received a request from Allied Universal Security Services, as well, requesting exemption from the requirement of 14B NCAC 16.0707 (c)(d)(1-10), the rules that relate to the training of unarmed guards. Mr. Gray reminded the committee that they do not have the authority to provide a specific exemption for each individual entity. Mr. MacRae encourage industry to continue a dialog with the Board. He also stated that if anyone have a better idea please feel free to share it with the Board.

Mr. MacRae reported that the committee received a request from Pam Shaw, Director of the National Polygraph Academy, to be listed as an approved polygraph school and for Cory Kramer, Captain with the High Point Police Department to be able to maintain updates of the approved polygraph schools list. Mr. MacRae stated that the committee asked Director Echols to assist Mr. Kramer in updating the polygraph schools list.

Mr. Johnson stated that he is currently looking at three different dates to conduct the rifle/shotgun training in January or February of 2017. LAW AND RULES COMMITTEE

Ms. Lawrimore reported that the Law and Rules Committee met on Wednesday, December 14, 2016 from 8:00 a.m. to 9:19 a.m. The committee members were Ms. Lawrimore, Mr. MacRae, Mr. Greene, Mr. Arndt, Mr. Fletcher, Mr. Cook, Mr. Cesena and Mr. Proctor.

Ms. Lawrimore reported that the main focus was on the new item that came up regarding personal protection. A Board member Mr. Benson did extensive research and made a presentation on rule change as opposed to a law change. This is not to add to but to simplify the matter for the industry. Ms. Lawrimore also set up a subcommittee that consisted of Mr. MacRae, Mr. Benson and herself along with three other industry members which is Gary Pastor, Greg Scott and Gregory Hanson. Also the committee continues working on a bill to be submitted to the legislature when they reconvene.

MOTION BY MR. CESENA TO ACCEPT THE LAW AND RULES COMMITTEE'S REPORT; SECONDED BY MR. BENSON; MOTION CARRIED.

FINANCE REPORT:

Mr. Fletcher reported that the committee finally had the first official Finance meeting, Wednesday, December 14, 2017 from 5:47 p.m. to 6:21 p.m. The committee members were Mr. Fletcher and Mr. MacRae. Mr. Fletcher stated PPS has sufficient funds to operate and may have overage. The committee is looking at different ways the funds can be used. One of the ways is the Permitium fees that have been discussed in previous meetings and with the full Board. The finance committee have met with Permitium and is trying to iron out the fee structure regarding the additional cost for applicants. Example: If the cost is \$7.00 per application and an estimate of 50,000 applications per year, the total cost will be \$350,000.00. The Finance Committee is considering that the Board absorb the cost instead of passing it on to the industry. The committee feels that there are sufficient funds to cover that expense.

He also stated that Mr. MacRae is looking into using community college training centers that a licensee can receive a certificate for continue education credits and possible college credits as well.

Ms. Lawrimore reminded the Finance Committee to look into the possibility of setting up a memorial scholarship fund.

Mr. Fletcher stated that he hopes to have something in place by the February Board meeting.

MOTION BY MR. MACRAE TO ACCEPT THE FINANCE COMMITTEE'S REPORT; SECONDED BY MR. GREENE; MOTION CARRIED.

Mr. Echols reported that a total of 3,765 registration cards have been printed and a total of 4,438 applications received since the last Board meeting.

He stated that the scanning project is taking longer than he anticipated due to the volume of documents that are being scanned but once the system is in place it will be better than the system that we are currently using.

Attorney Gray discussed the following:

Received second payment on October 10, 2016.

2. Chad Allen Burke - - On June 23, 2016 the Private Protective Services Board voted to enter into a consent agreement with Mr. Burke in the amount of \$9,180.00 registration violations. Payment has not been received.

3. Amanda Anne Kendall and DSI Security Services - On August 25, 2016 the Private Protective Services Board voted to enter into a consent agreement with Ms. Kendall in the amount of \$6,303.60 for registration violations. Payment has not been received.

4. Scott Siano and Universal Protection Services LLC - - On October 20, 2016 the Private Protective Services Board voted to enter into a consent agreement with Mr. Siano in the amount of \$73,807.20 for registration violations. Paid in full

Payment has not been received.

6. Nicole Shawyne Cassady and Liberty Crime Prevention Services - - On October 20, 2016 the Private Protective Services Board voted to enter into a consent agreement with Ms. Cassady in the amount of \$2,386.80 for registration violations. Paid in full

7. James Warren Carroll and Champion National Security, Inc., - - On October 20, 2016 the Private Protective Services Board voted to enter into a consent agreement with Mr. Carroll in the amount of \$6,599.60 for registration violations. Paid in full

8. David Lee Pettingell and Carolina Security Patrol - - On October 20, 2016 the Private Protective Services Board voted to enter into a consent agreement with Mr. Pettingell in the amount of \$489.60 for registration violations. Payment has not been received.

Mr. Greene stated that the Grievance committee would like to recommend to the Board that if Licensees are more than 60 days past due in consent payment(s), they will need to be rescheduled to go back to the grievance committee.

After a lengthy discussion regarding payment(s) of consent agreement:

The Board asked Mr. Gray to draft a letter to give to licensees at the grievance committee meeting for them to sign in the interim until the full Board meets.

OFFICE OF ADMINISTRATIVE HEARINGS

The schedule of hearings in the Office Administrative Hearings is attached to the Attorney's Report.

The Board currently has no pending rule adoptions or amendments.

IV. LEGISLATION

The Board currently has no pending legislation of interest.

V. PENDING CASES

For the past 38 months Attorney Gray has been reporting to the Board the status of a civil action filed against Board Investigator Sarah Conner, the Board, the City of Charlotte, the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department and various officers of the Charlotte-Mecklenburg PD in Kelly v. Conner, et al., No. 3:13-cv-636 - WDNC. (Mr. Kelly was unlicensed as a security guard business and unregistered as a security guard, but performing armed security guard and patrol services. He was arrested by the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department and charged with violating Chapter 74C.) The Court granted the Board's Motion to Dismiss Pursuant to Fed.R.Civ.P. 12(b) (6) and Motion for Summary Judgment, as well as similar motions filed by the other Defendants, on May 27, 2015 and this action was dismissed with prejudice. The Plaintiff gave notice of appeal on June 24, 2015, and the parties filed their respective Brief with the Fourth Circuit of Appeals on November 13, 2015.

Oral arguments in this matter would be held on Tuesday, October 25, 2016 in Richmond, Virginia and Robert M. McDonnell, the attorney for the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department and Mr. Gray will be sharing the Appellees allotted time. Member Justin Greene attended the arguments as the Board's representative.

In a very strange and sudden turn of events attorney Gray received the opinion of the court on November 11, 2016. The appeal was dismissed and the case remanded to the federal Magistrate Judge who heard the parties' motions for summary judgment.

In its simplest terms, the Court found that the Judge had failed to rule on two counts in the Plaintiff's Complaint and therefore only granted partial summary judgment; the granting if

only partial summary judgment is "interlocutory in nature," which means it cannot be appealed until the entire case is concluded. (A copy of the Court's opinion is attached.)

Mr. Gray reported that the Board had asked him to look into the education fund which he did confirm with the State Budget Office that there is nothing in the State budget manual that says the money had to go to a non-profit organization only. He also made several calls to the Chief Financial Officer at Department of Justice to inquire about the possible reason for the Board policy but never received and is waiting on a response.

Mr. Gray also reported that he received a letter from the North Carolina attorney representing GL Solutions, requesting the outstanding payments. He communicated with both ASLB and PPSB chairs, along with Director Echols and Deputy Director Foster. Mr. Gray will be meeting with DPS and State IT staff to discuss a response.
