The campaign ran in September 2020 on platforms such as YouTube, TikTok, and Facebook. Some of the most notable results were:

Display advertising campaigns are typically measured based on clickthrough rate (CTR), which is the rate at which people click on ads in a given platform. The average display advertising “CTR” is .08%. In many cases our outreach messages tripled or quadrupled the average click through rate.

The campaign drove 30,124 total pageviews to the website in one month.

The time spent on each landing page was significant, showing that people were highly engaged with the content.

Normally, people spend an average of less than 15 seconds on any given website. Here is the breakdown of time spent

on each campaign page.

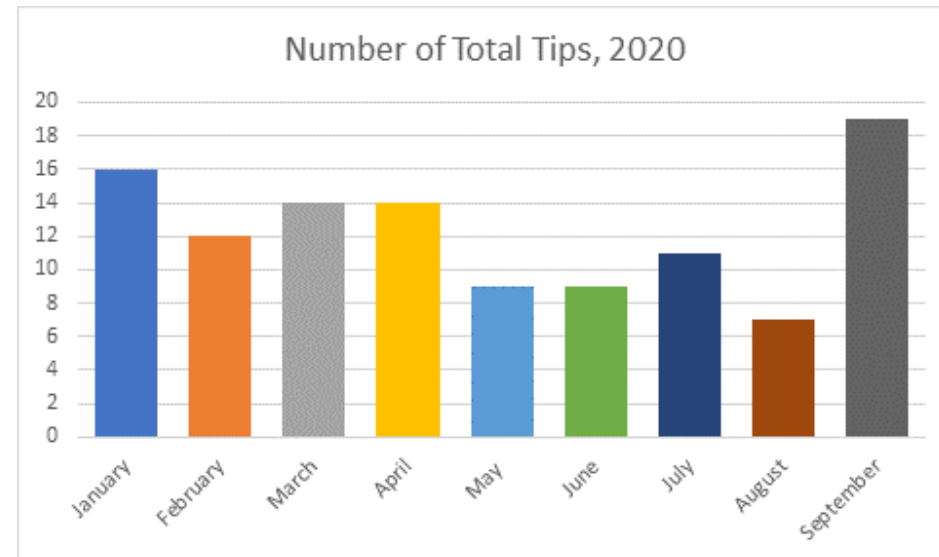

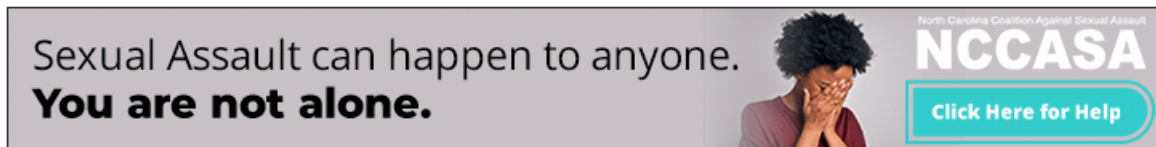

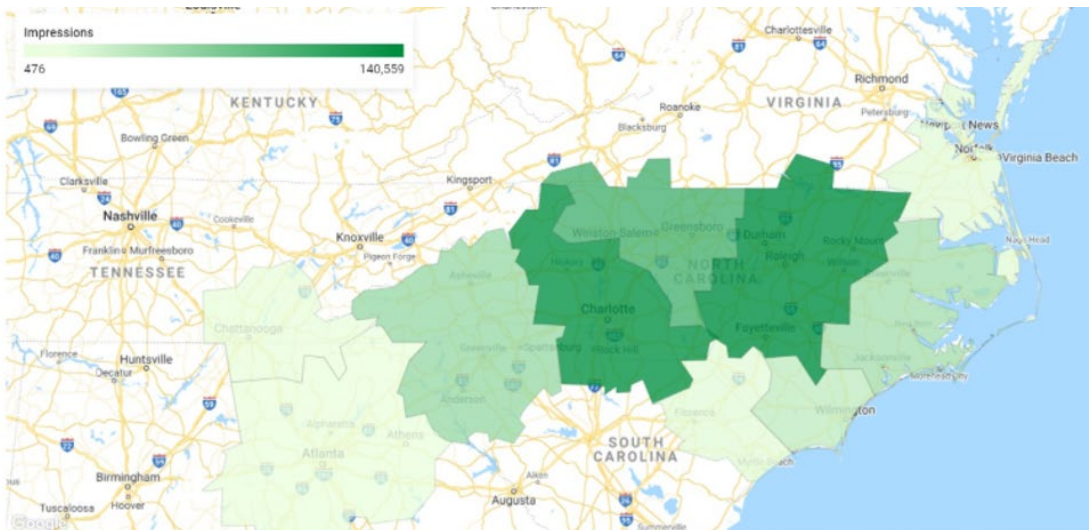

Priorities 2021 Applications - VOCA

- Agencies could submit no more than **three** total competitive applications
 - with only one application per priority
 - total is not inclusive of any Basic Services (noncompetitive) projects
- Funding for continuation projects was limited to 0% growth from their prior project.
- No caps were placed on competitive projects.

2021 VOCA - Child Advocacy Centers Basic Services (Designated agencies only)
2021 VOCA - Sexual Assault/Domestic Violence Basic Services (Designated agencies only)
2021 VOCA - Child Abuse Victims
2021 VOCA - Collaborative / Multi-Agency Models (Family Justice Centers)
2021 VOCA - Victims of Human Trafficking
2021 VOCA - Legal Services for Victims of Crime

Priorities 2021 Applications - VAWA

- Agencies could only submit **one** application under each VAWA priority
 - NOTE: A prosecutorial district was considered as a single subrecipient.

- Funding for continuation projects was limited to 0% growth from their prior project.

- Caps were placed on VAWA applications priorities:
 - Courts – \$195,775 designated agency only
 - Victim Services - \$200,000
 - Law Enforcement - \$140,000
 - Prosecutors - \$140,000
 - Discretionary –
 - Batterer’s Intervention Programs - \$55,000 individual county programs and \$100,000 for regional programs
 - Prevention Programs - \$55,000

2021 Applications

- ▶ Initially
 - 260 totaling \$103,705,061
- ▶ Now
 - 248 totaling \$92,329,892
- ▶ Eliminated ineligible projects
- ▶ Reduced continuation projects to 0% growth

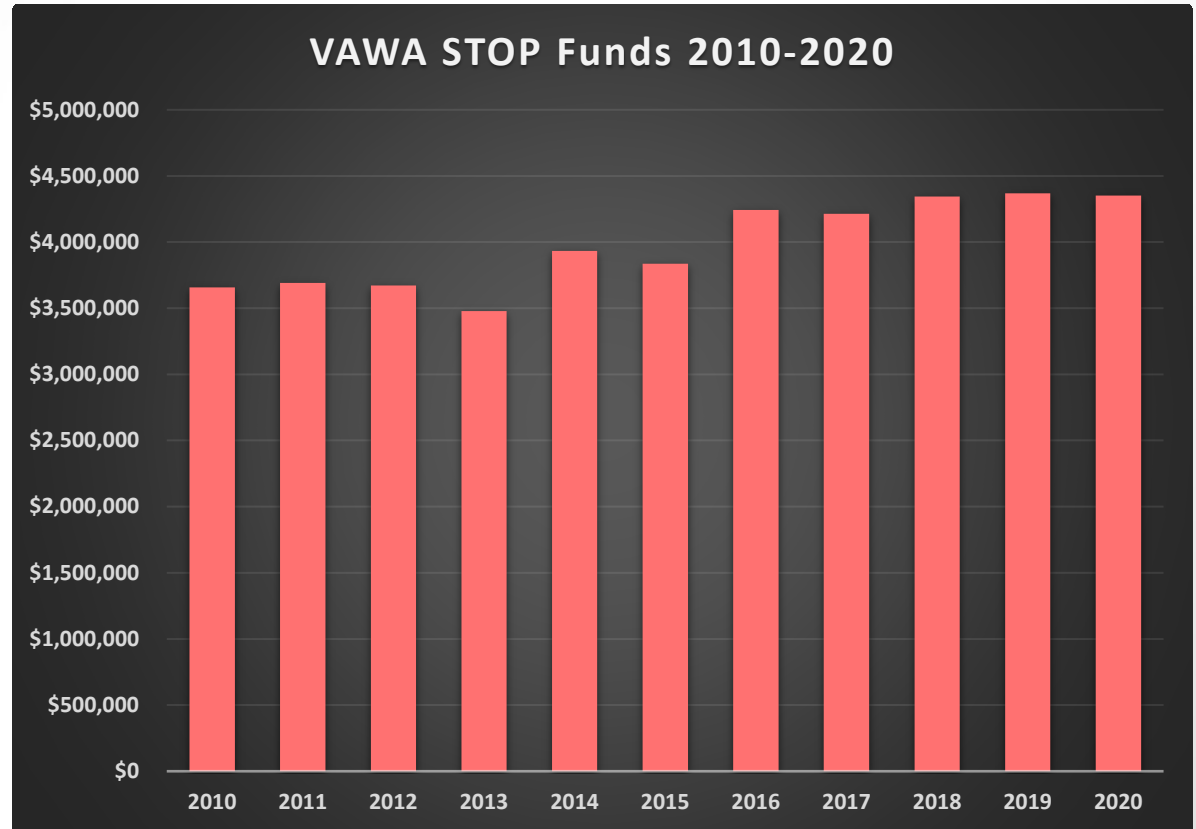
NC's 2021 VOCA and VAWA Allocations

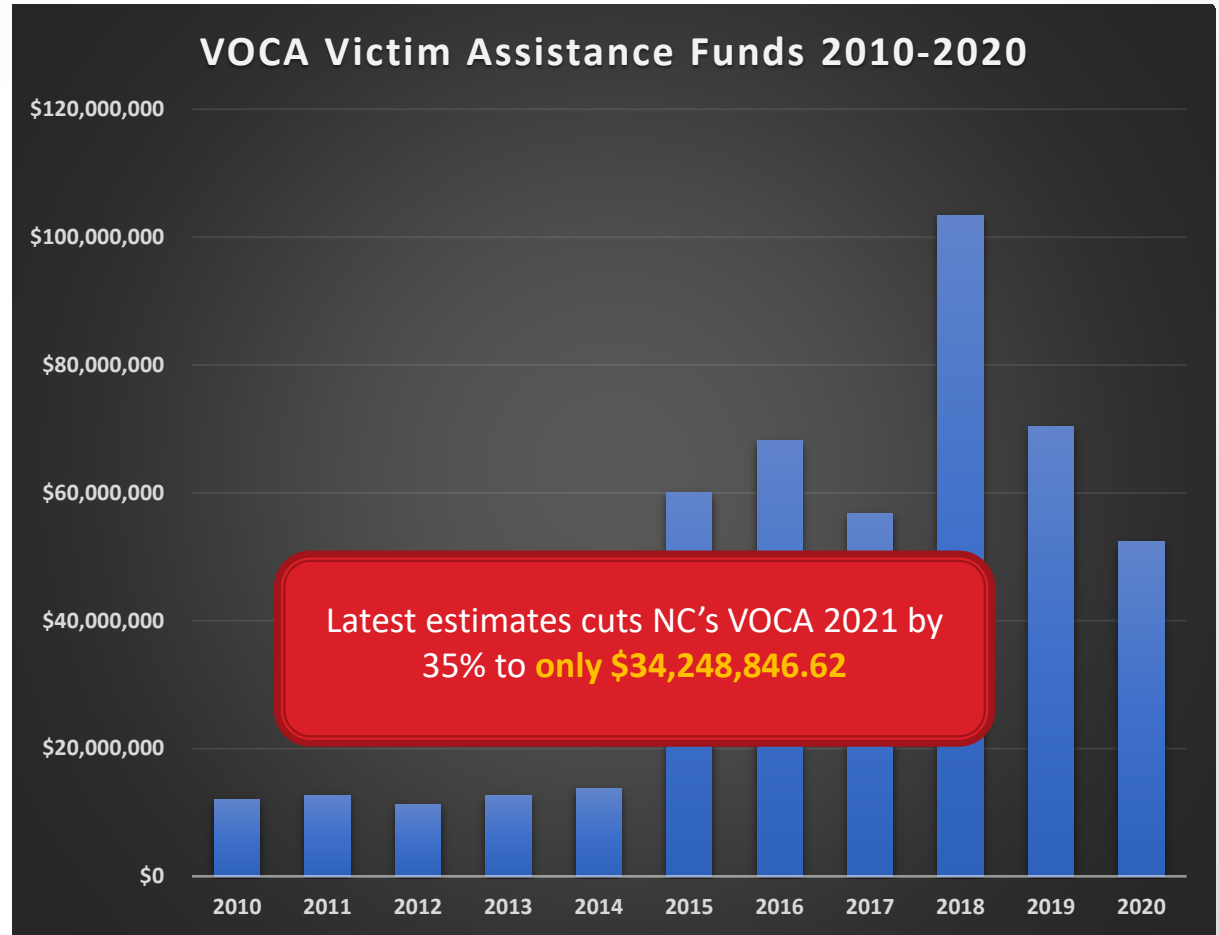

We do not yet know our NC's allocation of either VOCA or VAWA funds.

- ▶ VAWA is anticipated to be stable
- ▶ The concern is with VOCA
 - NC's anticipated amount = \$34,248,846.62
(35% reduction from 2020)
 - **66.8888% decrease since 2018**

2021 CVS Committee Application Review

- VOCA

- ❖ Basic Services projects – ensures NC meets the VOCA mandatory minimums and that NC has core, fundamental services for child abuse, domestic violence and sexual assault.

- Do you want to make further cuts?
- Basic Services agencies are divided between even and odd years.
- 2020 Basics split \$6.6M in each of the three categories (CA, DV, SA)
- 2021 Basics were allotted \$5.2M to split in each of the three categories (CA, DV, SA)
- This is a 21% reduction between the even year agencies and odd year agencies – further reductions to odd year agencies will increase this discrepancy.
