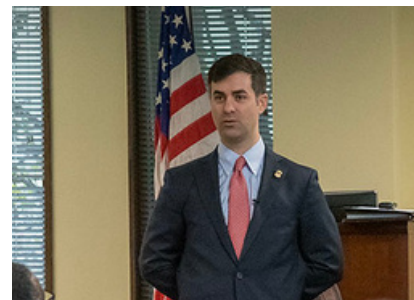

Site Visits Resume

Grant Administrators are now permitted to travel for in-person site visits. Priority scheduling will be for projects with an end date before Oct. 1, 2023, that haven't had a site visit yet. Your GA will work with grant recipients to schedule a date that allows for entrance and exit conferences, and for meetings with key staff. Keep an eye out for an email about required materials. Thorough and timely preparation allows your Grant Administrator to provide the best technical assistance possible.

CJAC Analyzes Domestic Violence, Firearm Offenses

The Criminal Justice Analysis Center released these February publications:

- Justice Analysis Review explains the importance of defining elements in data for an accurate count of incidents of domestic violence in NC.
- Domestic Violence Snapshot provides a summary of the 64,057 victims of partner or family violence in 2021.
- Firearm-Related Offenses in North Carolina in 2021 looks at the type of offense and at information on victims of incidents involving a firearm.
